Also the main location within Lyminge has been the Methodist Church Hall and we would also like to extend our thanks to the Church and its members for storing our filing cabinet and other bits and pieces.

Currently we have a printed index to part of the archive so once all the boxes and the filing cabinet are relocated to the Village Hall we will need to produce a full catalogue. The finished catalogue will be held as a simple printed subject index and also in a more sophisticated way on a computer which will allow us to search the catalogue. Finally, we hope to put the catalogue along with some digital copies from the archive on to the internet. We have to thank the Millennium Fund Committee for a generous donation allowing us to obtain a computer and printer for use in the archive.
