My New Years resolution is to communicate more effectively with you all, by means of the news letter, to keep you better informed, both of crime trends and community issues. I have already broken my resolution twice, as I have missed the deadline for last month, the month before and nearly this one and am having to plead with Jean to get it in this edition!

Crime in general across the whole of the Elham Valley is very low, with the exception of precious metals, like lead and copper still being stolen from many locations like Church roofs, and commercial premises. This is, as I am sure you all are aware, is because of the high demand due to the high price the metals are fetching.

Anti-Social Behaviour is also not too bad at the moment, with only a few incidences reported in the last few months and I am glad to say that the majority of the younger people in our community are to be proud of and have been very pro active in helping with the new sports facilities which are now in place at Jubilee Field. If anyone can think of ways of supporting the outstanding work of Lyminge Youth Action by carrying out any fund raising work and donating some money to help fund the completion of the project it would be much appreciated I'm sure.

As for the minority of young people that continue with ASB, smashing bottles, damaging property, Graffiti and loud unfavourable language etc- you have probably, by now, had a visit from a police officer or a letter to your parents stating that you have been involved in this behaviour. Please take their advice and refrain from it, as criminal damage or other incidents of that nature will hold you back in later life if on your record. Apart from that, it is not nice to be known in your own community for these things.

<u>Push Bike Found in Lyminge</u> Anyone lost a bike recently? - please call and describe it to me and I can hopefully reunite it with its owner.

<u>Door Sales People</u> selling pictures Some reports of these people have come in recently, and although these people have stories of their families starving or waiting for operations etc, they are an organised gang hitting different areas every day. It's up to you if you buy from them of course, but I would suggest not to as they are breaking the law, as it is a crime to sell at the door unless they can produce a valid Peddlers licence. Last year I met one of these sellers and went to the trouble to go to the police station to get him an application for a licence. But guess what-he didn't meet me the next day to collect it and his mobile was off! And finally it's great to see everyone enjoying the new Sports Facility at Jubilee Field but could I ask you all to pick up any litter, even if someone else forgets. If you see anyone deliberately littering, please let me know and I can take it up with them. Regards Gary

Dear Editor

I read with concern in the March edition of the Lyminge Newsletter that 'the Parish Council is planning to purchase 'Speed Watch' equipment' and that 'the Scheme requires 9-12 volunteers to share the monitoring duties'.

While I wholly agree with the need to reduce speeds on roads through the parish, I wonder whether this is really the best way to achieve this objective. I find it surprising indeed that the Parish Council should consider it appropriate to introduce camera surveillance into a rural community like Lyminge. In this country we are already one of the most spied-upon nations on the planet. Camera surveillance may be seen as a necessary evil in towns. Do we really want to introduce such a system into our rural community as well?

But what is perhaps worse is the proposal that the system needs to be run by volunteers from the community. It seems the idea is to set up individuals with the authority of the Parish Council to spy and inform on their neighbours. This could create situations where volunteers are subject to intimidation. Equally, volunteers themselves could misuse or abuse the position they have and the information they obtain, or they could be open to allegations that they have done so. These are possible scenarios that should not be contemplated lightly.

I wonder whether the implications of the proposals have really been thought through. I also

wonder whether, whatever their legal powers to make such a decision, it is appropriate for the Parish Council to take such a step without widespread consultation and community approval. There are ways to curb traffic speeds, such as using chicanes and 'sleeping policemen', that are less invasive of civil liberties.

If the choice is between either paying for traffic calming or promoting surveillance and potential vigilantism, I know which I would support. There is the option to have a one-off increase in the parish precept to pay for effective and appropriate traffic controls. At the very least, can we not have a public debate about what is the best way to cut down speeding in a way that is in keeping with our rural community?

Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

Q5 Did Lyminge ever have a village band?

Q6 Why is Lyndon Hall situated so close to Canterbury Road? (Thanks to Pam Anderson.)

Q7 Have buzzards ever been seen in the parish?

A5 Two village bands have come to light. Both were linked to the churches but at different times. First there was the gallery band that provided music for church services in St. Mary & St. Ethelburga Church in the 18th & 19th centuries. Charles Igglesden, writing in A Saunter through Kent with Pen and Picture, Volume 3 (Kentish Express, 1901, Ashford) says that 'formerly the vestry was situated beneath the tower and over the tower arch ... stood a gallery where the village musicians led the singing' of metrical psalms with 'cello and clarionette'.

The other village band was associated with Lyminge Methodist Church and was known as Lyminge Silver Band. Mrs Mary Mount contacted me and told me of hearing the band at Stelling Minnis Wesleyan Methodist Church when she was ten years old. She remembered that the band were 'excellent musicians and played delightful music.' Alan Boughton has introduced me to Bert Fagg. Bert remembers the band well because several of his family played in the band. He told me that so many members were Faggs the band were sometimes known as the 'Woodbine' Band! The band was led by Mr Alfred Jacob, a prominent Methodist, hence the connection with the church. Apparently the band was formed after WWI. Initially the ensemble was a brass band but Mr Finn - Kelcey became president and kindly donated silver instruments. The ensemble played in many competitions and was well known around the district. They folded with the onset of WWII probably because Mr Jacob had died and because this 'front line' village had more important things to be concerned about. To finish, here is a photograph of the band in 1930 after they had won at the Tunbridge Wells and District Band Contest and a copy of the certificate they won.
