Lyminge Day Fruit Cake Competition

Good luck. Ingredients

Half a pound (250g) each of: butter, flour, currants, candied peel and sugar

Half of a grated nutmeg

A few chopped almonds

Juice and rind of one lemon

4 eggs.

Method

Beat the butter to a cream, add the eggs one by one and then add the other ingredients.

Bake in a paper lined and greased tin for 1 to 2 hours

The oven must not be too hot.


