Considering how busy he must be it is good that he has time to visit us.

It's also the time of year to remember all the questions that have been asked through these articles. Listing them, once in a while, refreshes everybody's memory and maybe some new answers will emerge.

- Q1 What is the origin of local place names?
- Q2 Why does the Nailbourne flow continually in Lyminge yet at Elham it is often dry?
- Q3 Did the dilapidated gates at Yew Tree Cross have a use and was there another set?
- Q4 Did Lyminge ever have a village band?
- Q5 Why is Lyndon Hall situated so close to Canterbury Road?
- Q6 Have buzzards ever been seen in the parish?
- Q7 Who was the most notable local inhabitant?
- Q8 What is the history of the local sports clubs, past & present?
- Q9 Does anyone have any information about Lyminge's livestock market?
- Q10 What was Lyminge's involvement in the 1830 'Captain Swing' agricultural riots?
- Q11 What was the locality like during World War 2?
- Q12 Have there been any particular celebratory events in Lyminge? (e.g. Christmas)
- Q13 Does anyone have any special reminiscences concerning Lyminge School?
- Q14 What is the history of the local churches and their choirs?
- Q15 What public houses have there been in the locality?
- Q16 What is the history of the Parish Church's bells and the bell ringers
- Q17 What is the history of Teddars Leas, Teddars Leas Lane & Teddars Leas House?
- Q18 Has anybody seen any weasels or stoats locally?
- Q19 Are there any environmental projects in progress in the locality?
- Q20 What is the history of St Mary's Hospital, Etchinghill?

I have tidied up the list a little. An example is the 'sports club' question. I have been able to pass on some of the history of Lyminge Football Club and the Green Owls Hockey Club in the past. I hope the question's reorganisation will prompt others to let me know the history of other clubs such as cricket and bowls.

I have received some information about weasels. Neil Hartup contacted me and said that he recently saw a weasel as he was coming down Longage Hill. In its mouth was a mouse which is one of weasels' usual prey. Apparently, you can, sometimes, see weasels carrying their young in their mouth. In this instance it was the wrong time of year. Neil also said that, in the past, he has seen a weasel exploring his patio. Has anyone else seen a weasel or a stoat?

As I sit here writing this article, it is a blustery and rainy day outside my window. You could definitely say it is good weather for ducks. In fact, this morning I saw the biggest 'squadron' of ducks I think I have ever seen locally. About 15 mallards have been repeatedly circling around Etchinghill. They have not been flying in 'Red Arrow' V formation but rather in a disorganised rabble. Eventually, I think they probably settled on the remains of the watercress beds near the source of the Eastbrook Stream. I have not seen such a big flock of mallards behaving in such a way. Perhaps the gusty wind was the cause? Can anyone explain their actions? I know that ducks have been present in Station Road, at the entrance to Lyminge, for many years and this sets up a new question in my mind: Q21 Are there any stories about the ducks in the locality?

Winter is definitely coming. I am sorry that there are no rain figures this month. The rain gauge has not been working. The good news is that it is now functioning and next month I will be able to tell you about the five inches of rain that fell in one day! That's all for this month. May I take the opportunity to wish you all a very happy Christmas.


