

Report from our Community Warden - Gary Harrison

The Skate Park, Tennis Court, children's play area, teen shelter, 5 a side goals and the newest of the equipment installed recently around the outside of the football pitch are being used well by all ages of the community. It's great to see all the hard work from Lyminge Youth Action is coming to fruition with some more equipment for outside exercise coming soon. It's hard to believe the transformation of this area within a few years when LYA first formed but here it is for all to enjoy. Sadly there has been some graffiti in the teen shelter for which the people who did it were soon identified and made to clean it off. Please help to keep this area clean and tidy and if you see anyone damaging it please report it to myself or LYA or if the damage is being committed while you are there call the police. Many of the young people of Lyminge helped with raising the money for the facilities and even did some hard labour, digging out and laying the foundations for the Teen shelter etc, so please take ownership and look after it. GRAFFITI IS CRIMINAL DAMAGE and will be treated as so if anyone is found doing it.

I have noticed since I have been in Lyminge there are a minority of people who do not report crime to the police as they say nothing ever happens and often they do not even attend. Although I sympathise with the logic I have always tried to explain that policing has changed somewhat over the years, where jobs are prioritised and unless the local police officer/PCSO is on duty, not all calls will get a response unless classed as urgent. However this does not mean your call is wasted, as it is logged on the system and a report is sent out for the attention of the PCSO/Beat Officer who will take it up when next on duty and will share the information with myself and any other parties that may be relevant like Shepway dog warden or parking attendants for example. If a pattern develops, we will target the areas with the necessary patrols or visit the people who we think are responsible. IF YOU DO NOT REPORT IT YOU CANNOT COMPLAIN IF NO ACTION IS TAKEN AND YOUR AREA MAY BE LEFT OUT WHEN PATROLLING AND THAT VITAL PIECE OF INFORMATION THAT MAY HELP SOLVE A CRIME COULD BE MISSED.

Perhaps we could all consider our neighbours. With all the windows and doors open it doesn't take long for smoke to fill the house and it is very difficult to get rid of the smell. Let's enjoy this lovely weather – we don't have it that often!

Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

A few months ago I asked about folk songs from the locality (Q23). Although no songs have been suggested to me, research has revealed the following folk songs from South East Kent which might have been found here. George Frampton in 'Bygone Kent', Volume 16, No. 1, describes various folk singers and their songs including Ambrose Collard of Alkham who had among his repertoire 'Wraggle Taggle Gypsies', 'The Old Arm Chair', and 'Sail Home as Straight as an Arrow'. Ambrose was a local landowner and he was known to sing these songs during World War II. George Frampton also refers to the Appleton family. They came from Alkham as well and were renowned folksingers. Their songs have come to us through George Spicer a well known singer who latterly lived in Sussex but grew up in Kent and learnt most of his songs here. For example, 'Cut Away Mike', and 'The Folkestone Murder' came from his father-in-law, Sydney Appleton. Also, George Spicer may have learnt 'The Faithful Sailor Boy' from Sydney's brother, Will or from Sydney's mother, Rosa Hickmott of Sellindge. Aldington was found to be a good source of songs by Francis Collinson during WW II (see the English Folk Dance & Song Society, Take 6 website http://library.efdss.org/archives/index.html). For example, from Mr Greengrass came 'Mutiny at the Nore', and from Mr Wanstall came 'The Oak & The Ivy'. Most productive were the Lancefield brothers of Aldington, Ted & John. Amongst their songs was 'The Woodside Woodison' which may have been a 'charity' song to raise money for the families of sailors who were killed in the sinking of a Folkestone ship, 'The Woodside' in 1894 or 1895. The last verse runs: 'Lets try and help the children and wives,

> Of those poor men who lost their lives. Be kind to them, they're all forlorn, For the Woodside's lost and all are gone.'

Mr John Lott, who has lived in the village most of his life, has been in contact and has let me know where the gates at Sibton Park were situated en route to Rhodes Minnis. The first set were at Yew Tree Cross where a lot of us remember their remains being. The other set were to be found just past Sibton Park at the bottom of Longage Hill. As a boy, He remembers a friend swinging on the second gate and so opening it just in time to allow a runaway bicyclist through, this averted certain disaster. Apparently the bicyclist continued until the upturn towards Yew Tree Cross. Then he turned round, came back to the boy and gave him half-a-crown for his good deed. Twelve and a half pence does not sound much today but you can be certain it was worth a lot at that time.

John also told me that he, Bill Stacey and John Gough published the red, black and white document in April 1963 entitled 'LYMINGE No 1' that I mentioned before. John himself dealt with the advertising while the two others wrote the editorial content.




