Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

This month I thought I would start with the history of a local sporting club (Q3), namely Lyminge Bowls Club. The source of this information comes from the The Railway Swing Band concert programme organised by the club as part of its 75th Anniversary. I am grateful to the club's chairman, Mr David Taylor, for his assistance and permission to use this source. The club was formed in 1933 and matches were initially played on the Vicarage's lawn. As the club thrived, some land was bought where the club is now (next to the later built Scout Hut and Village Hall). A WW1 hut was purchased, when it became surplus to the needs of Toc H, and set up as their first clubhouse. The 1970's saw another redundant hut being purchased (this time after construction of Dungeness Power Station). The next decade saw increasing membership but also the loss of the clubhouse's roof twice because of storms. In the 1990s, Lottery funding through Sport England allowed the construction of the present well-built contemporary building. Lyminge Bowls Club has won major honours in Shepway Bowls Association's competition and over the last decade the club has won the East Kent Bernard Annand competition twice. Many members have achieved their County Badge. The club has been honoured to be the host club for a number of final and semi-final matches which are held on neutral ground. New members are welcome and anyone who wishes to take up the sport can join coaching sessions on Sunday mornings in May. Can anyone provide any information about other sports clubs in the locality?

Moving on, I am grateful to Mr David Godden for an explanation as to why Lyndon Hall closely adjoins Canterbury Road(Q5). Apparently, "before the arrival of the railway ... the main route through Lyminge comprised Broad Street, into Mayfield Road and Well Road. Where the Coach & Horses now stands the road divided into the High Street and Church Road. Church Road ran approximately along the present route, passing between Old Robus and Lyndon Hall. Thus, Lyndon Hall at this time stood back from the road." I am not certain when this might have been? Old maps on the www.hereshistorykent.org.uk website show that at least since 1769, roads have circled round Tayne Field as they do today. Maybe there was no bridge across the Nailbourne and therefore it was harder to transverse the Station Road / Canterbury Road route? Incidentally, in researching this, I have come across a map of Kent (John Cary's 1787 Atlas) which shows an interesting name for the Nailbourne. It appears to be called the "Wantshein." Can anyone throw any light on why this might be?

Lyminge Historical Society's oral history project is continuing this Summer. If you have volunteered in the past to have your reminiscences of the locality recorded, we will be in touch with you shortly to arrange for me to interview you. If you haven't volunteered so far, then please consider doing so and contact me. The recordings will be put in the Lyminge Historical Society's archive at Lyminge Village Hall. This archive is open to all and it is hoped that the recordings will provide further information for articles in the 'Lyminge, a history' booklet series.






