BOULES, BOULES, BOULES

The game of boules, otherwise known as Petanque, is perhaps the sport that is closest to French hearts. Similar to British lawn bowling, it is played with metallic balls on a dirt surface with a glass of pastis at hand. The object of the game is to throw or lob the metal boules as close to a small ball called a cochonnet (similar to the bowls jack) Points are scored to boules nearest the cochonnet.

Thousands of French citizens play the game but it has now spread worldwide. There is a British Petanque Association with some 300 clubs affiliated.

Games can be played on a flat or "nearly" flat dirt ground but more official games are played on a terrain (court).

Elham boast a three-lane terrain and regular games are played on it. An inter-village competition has been played over the last two years. A team representing Etchinghill played both years.

Enthusiasts from Etchinghill would now like to see a Petanque terrain built in the parish, which would be available to the residents of Lyminge Parish. The skills are simple and families could enjoy playing the game. Equipment is cheap; a set of boules, depending on quality can be bought for some £10/20 upwards.

The residents of Bishopsbourne recently built their own terrain. Using self-help labour they built their terrain for £1400.

The Etchinghill Residents Association and the Etchinghill Village Hall Management Committee have agreed in principle to support the venture.

A possible site for a Petanque terrain might be one adjacent to the Etchinghill Village Hall

A sporting facility available to everyone is the goal of some boules players in both Etchinghill and Lyminge. The views and hopefully support for such a venture would be appreciated. Friends of Kent Churches sponsored bike ride

This annual event took place this year on Saturday September 11th. From 10am onwards, hundreds of cyclists throughout Kent pedalled furiously from their various start points to visit as many churches as possible before 6pm. Most of the 20 or so riders from Lyminge set a more sedate pace due to the impediments such as child-on-back-of-bike, arthritic joints, no-good bikes, etc. However it was great to several youngsters in our group who intend to carry on the tradition.

Once again, due to the enthusiasm of the riders and their fund-raising efforts, an amazing total was reached. This year it was £837, which I think must be a record! Our thanks go to those who sponsored us and those who sat in church to meet with visiting riders.

One half of the money raised will go to our parish church, the rest goes to the Friends to be added to their central fund. Any church of any denomination can request a donation from the central fund to help with repairs to the fabric of their church building. Last year over £150,000 was raised through this event and distributed to needy churches in Kent.

Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

Last month's ghost story has resulted in several other local ghost stories being told to me. As it is still very near Halloween, I will pass these stories onto you. Firstly, a local resident has told me the following story,

"A colleague of mine told me ... [what] she witnessed whilst driving through Etchinghill in June 2010. ... [She is] very sensible, not known for telling tall tales or believing in anything supernatural She was driving through the village on Canterbury Road on her way to Lyminge at about 5.30pm. It was still light even though it was raining heavily. As she drove past the entrance to St Mary's Drive she saw a woman in a long rain coat standing on the pavement waiting to cross the road. She slowed down and came to a stop as the lady stepped into the road and started to cross. As she reached the middle of the road she turned to look at my friend and then "evaporated" into thin air.

All the stories, I have heard, seem to relate to Saint Mary's Hospital. There have been several reports of a ghostly matron being seen wandering the corridors of the hospital before it was pulled down. Perhaps the disappearing woman at the entrance to Meriden Park was that old matron. As well as the hospital's staff, ghosts of patients were apparently seen in the old building that was built as the workhouse for the locality. Perhaps, these ghosts relate not to the hospital phase (1947-1990) of the building but to the work house phase (1835-1947). (See www.workhouses.org.uk/index.html?Elham/Elham.shtml for more details.) The building complex also included an isolation ward for infectious disease in Westfield Lane and the local spike. That is, there was a department that gave food, shelter and a bed for tramps, in return for menial work. Older villagers tell of stories where the tramps would jump over the walls to avoid the work, having been fed!

Back to the ghosts. Finally, I have two specific stories about happenings that occurred in the wards of the hospital. Both come from the 1980s and the first occurred one night on Harvey Ward. Suddenly, a gust of wind blew along the corridor, opened the swing doors and swept all the posters and notices off the notice board. But the weather outside the hospital was completely calm. What caused this wind? Nobody scientific explanation has been offered. The second story concerns Simpson Ward, when a grey hooded figure was seen rummaging through the laundry in the ward's sluice. It seemed as soon as it realized that it had been seen, it disappeared from view. Who was this person; a former workhouse inmate or staff member; or a nurse from a previous time? Like last month, I hasten to add, that no one has been physically hurt by these ghosts so we should not be unduly frightened by them. Perhaps an explanation is that, certain buildings act like recorders and under particular conditions replay previous happenings?


