



Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

A couple of months ago, I speculated that I had seen a raven circling on the thermals above the North Downs' escarpment (Q25). They are known to be nesting on the White Cliffs and to be foraging on Romney Marsh so a sighting seems possible. Since then, Mr David Godden has told me that in April, this year, he saw a Raven in his garden, in Lyminge, feeding on food left out for the birds. Recently he has added, "We have seen the Raven twice more. It flies over at some height, never coming into the garden. It does settle from time to time in the trees [near the Parish Church]. It's size make it easy to pick out from other birds."

I think it is fascinating that this most noble of birds has been seen in the locality. Has anybody else seen a raven nearby? As Mr Godden points out, ravens are much larger than other black birds having a wing span of 4 to 5 feet (1.2 - 1.5m). In comparison, a crow, the next largest black bird, has a wingspan of 3 to 3½ feet (0.9 - 1.1m). Other notable features of ravens are: a long, very thick bill; a wedge or diamond shaped, long tail; and long, 'fingered' wings.

Moving on, I have been reading a book about the pub games of Britain (A Taylor, Played at the Pub, (2009) Swindon: English Heritage.). Of interest, I have discovered that the Rose and Crown at Elham was the first public house in England to have a bar billiard table installed, in December 1933. At that time, to play a game of bar billiards cost 6d (3p) and a pint of beer cost 4d (2p).

This has set me thinking about what pub games/sports have been been played at the local pubs. At the Coach and Horses, I remember darts, pool, and cribbage being played. Quiz nights are held there at present and Lyminge Football Club is based there. I also recall that there was an outdoor skittle alley, at the back of the pub, bordering on Tayne Field, in the 1980s. Memorable were the typical summer evening sounds of balls rolling along the alley, followed by the fall of skittles and the cheery banter of the rival teams. Darts has been played at the New Inn but I am unaware of any other pub games/sports being played locally. Does anyone know of others? (Q26). If you do then please contact me. In particular, was Bat and Trap, one of the forerunners of cricket, ever played locally?

Sibton Park Cricket Club Fund Raising West to East Challenge 14th-19th August

Mark Dobson (ex, Kent Cricketer and England Ladies Coach) and I, Andy Allon, will be travelling down to Lands' End on 14th August to cycle the 450 mile journey back to Sibton Park Cricket Club arriving back in the early evening of Friday 19th August. We are completing the ride to raise money for two projects, the development of Sibton Park's indoor facilities (for the benefit of all the community) and the Kenyan Manyatta Project, which is to reduce the impact of deforestation and help develop the local educational facilities.

The money raised for the Kenyan Manyatta Project so far has been of an enormous benefit to the area. For instance, in order to attend school, parents have to provide all the exercise books, pens, pencils etc. as well as contributing to the school running costs. When the average daily wage is the equivalent of £1.50, the purchase of such items is a considerable drain on a family income. All pupils in the village nursery school as well as the children of people who work in the tree nursery have been provided with books and stationery to last them a year. The tree nursery has also benefitted with contributions towards a huge water tank, seeds, seed bags and other running costs. Nursery provision is very much the poor part of the Kenyan education system. The village has to provide the buildings and any equipment and the parental contribution pays the teachers' salaries. The Nursery School in Manyatta is in dire need of assistance to make it fit for purpose, such as a water supply, a ceiling and proper windows.


