

Protecting and serving the people of Kent

As there has been an increase in shed burglaries across the region, please find the below for handy hints and tips on how to keep your belongings safe. While many people take steps to protect their homes, they often forget the value of the items stored outside. Garden sheds, outbuildings and garages packed with tools, machinery and other valuable equipment offer easy pickings to thieves. Each year owners lose many thousands of pounds worth of equipment which is often untraceable. By taking the right precautions you can reduce the opportunities for thieves and ensure that if your property is stolen, there's a better chance of it being traced and returned. Here's how you can cut the risk of theft:

- Always put tools and equipment away safely – items left lying around outside could be stolen or used to help a thief break in
- Disable lawn mowers and other large machinery when not in use and chain items together to a solid anchor point
- Record details of your property (make, model, serial number and identifying marks) and take photographs of items for easy identification
- Use close shackle padlocks to secure sheds and install shed alarms and security lights
- Register your valuables on the National Property Database –www.immobilise.com
- Security-mark your property using a UV pen or a forensic marking solution
- Ensure the screws are not accessible when using a hasp and staple lock or pad bolts
- Prevent unwanted visitors from entering your garden by maintaining hedges and fences
- Close your garden gate and lock it from the inside
- Use lockable hanging baskets or secure the baskets to their brackets
- Avoid leaving house doors and windows open or unlocked when working in the garden

If you see it, report it. Contact Kent Police.

If a crime is in progress or life is in danger, call 999. For all non-urgent crime reports or enquiries, call 101.

If you are deaf or speech impaired, text 'police' then your message to 60066.

Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

Last month's article concluded with some local information found in the *Domesday Book*, the Norman property and tax assessment of the whole of England, following the 1066 invasion. This month we will continue the subject using www.domesdaymap.co.uk and *Domesday Book, Vol. 1, Kent*, Ed. P.Morgan, Tr. V.Sankaran, (1983) Phillimore, Chichester as sources. Lyminge was a large community but it was not the largest in the locality. Folkestone consisted of 395 and Saltwood 272 households compared to Lyminge's 120 although all three can be considered to be very large communities at that time. Saxon/Norman communities tended to be quite small.

Lyminge had arable land that had enough work for 60 ploughs (of 8 Oxen) in one year. Other resources taxed in the Manor of Lyminge included woodland. In the *Domesday Book*, woodland is measured in units that relate to the use of the land. In Lyminge the units used are pigs so presumably they were the produce of Lyminge's woodland (known as *pannage*). The *Domesday Book* states that the size of Lyminge's woodland was 111 pigs. It could be that the woodland was actually large enough to provide for these pigs or that the land was nominally assessed as that size. What is not clear is where this woodland was. It may have been situated in Lyminge manor's *dens* in the Weald where pigs would be moved in the winter. (Archbishop Pecham's survey (1283-1285) reveals that woodland *dens* attached to the archiepiscopal Manor of Lyminge were to be found in the extreme south-west of Kent in the parishes of Sandhurst Benenden Rolvenden Tenterden and Woodchurch. See the February 2011 *Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers* for more information about *dens*.) It is often the case, in the *Domesday Book*, that the land being recorded is not adjoining so it is quite possible that the woodland was in the Weald.

The *Domesday Book* recorded 3 mills in Lyminge. These would have been watermills, as windmills did not exist in England until about 100 years later. There was also 1 fishery. If these resources were all situated on the Nailbourne and not elsewhere, then the flow of water in the river may have been considerably greater than it is today. Was this because of increased rainfall? (It is reported that the Nailbourne's flow reduced when the Etchinghill tunnel was dug in the construction of the Elham Valley Railway but this may not explain the whole reduction in flow.) Lyminge manor had three churches recorded according to the *Domesday Book*. One would have been the present Lyminge parish church; another would have been Paddlesworth parish church but I am uncertain where the third church would have been. Perhaps, like other features recorded in the *Domesday Book*, it was situated at a distance from the village such as in the Weald or on Romney Marsh where it is known that the manor had land.

In 1066, Lyminge's Lord of the Manor was the Archbishop of Canterbury whilst in 1086, at the time of the *Domesday* survey, the Manor land was divided between the Archbishop of Canterbury, Osbern Paisforiere, Robert of Hardres and Robert son of Watson. These were tenants holding land from the main landholder, Lord of the Manor or tenant-in-chief whose only overlord was the King. In 1086 this was the Archbishop of Canterbury. I hope this brief description of *Domesday Book* Lyminge gives a picture of what Lyminge was like at that time. If anyone has further thoughts on the subject including any errors I might have made, please contact me.

Welcome to the first major instalment of the blog that will follow the Lyminge Archaeology project! We've had a very busy few weeks since hearing that we've been granted AHRC funding for three years' work within the village, continuing our excavations of Lyminge's Anglo-Saxon monastic origins. The team has come together to begin organising the excavations that will be held this summer, further geophysical survey has been done (I'll be posting about this later in the week) and things are falling into place for what looks to be a great summer of archaeology in Lyminge – although we predict it might be a bit wet!

On Monday 9th July key members of the Lyminge team and representatives from the village attended the British Archaeology Awards, held at the British Museum, London.
