## Lyminge Historical Society

The *Society* was formed in 1971 to promote and study the history of Lyminge and the surrounding area. We hold a series of talks during the year as well as organising short visits to local places of historical interest and an annual day trip - see below. When held, talks occur at 7:45pm on the first Tuesday of the month in the *Tayne Centre*. We always welcome new members and visitors.

We sponsor the Lyminge Family History Group where members meet to help each other with their family history research.

The Society also maintains an ever-expanding local archive that can be accessed on request.

The Society researches and publishes books and pamphlets on local history such as the current series of 'LYMINGE a history'. In future we hope to complete the mapping of the grave plots in the churchyard and determine the locations of the lost Parish boundary markers.

As you may know Lyminge is the subject of recent archaeological digs carried out for Reading University by Dr Gabor Thomas. At the end of each dig the *Historical Society* hosts an open community meeting to hear Dr Thomas talk about the season's findings. The excavations which started in 2008 are expected to continue until 2014.

#### Membership

Membership brings many benefits including the right to buy tickets on the outings we organise. In previous years, we have organised outings to Westenhanger Castle, the Hawkinge Air Museum, Fordwich Town Hall, Lympne Castle and Buckingham Palace. This year we are off to Faversham Powder Mills, Charing Centre and Dover Castle The membership year runs from January to December and the fee is £10.00 which includes membership of the *Lyminge* Family History Group for the year.





## Theatre Company brings the hippy '60's to Lyminge

The Rude Mechanical Theatre Company will be on Tayne Field, Lyminge, on **Sunday 1**<sup>st</sup> **July** (at 7.30pm) with a new play set in the 1960's called **'Who Saw Marjory Daw?'** They are a very popular professional touring theatre company who specialise in bringing new plays to mainly small rural communities. The play is a 'comic mystery' and takes forward the characters of Gerald and Agnes Church from 'Gentle Harry's Farm' as he gets involved in politics and she becomes a rookie reporter who investigates the strange disappearance of a young celebrity hippy, Marjory Dawson, against a background of flower power, free love, incompetent secret agents, and a dubious arms deal with an exotic North African rebel leader. It should be hilarious and surreal!

It promises to be another hilarious helping from The Rudes with new songs and script by Pete Talbot and music arranged and directed by 'The Divine Comedy' bass player, Grant Gordon. Tickets can be probably be bought locally. Watch out on posters where it will be. In the meantime they can be bought from the Central Box Office (01323-501260), or online (www.therudemechanialtheatre.co.uk), but note that concessions will only be available *in advance* (at least a £1 off every ticket & group rates). On the night they will be £13 for adults and £7 for children.

## Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

Recently, Margaret Gillmore has been in touch and has told me about her father who used to live in Lyminge. I think her words will stimulate memories in those who have lived here a long time and will be be of interest to those who have come to live in the locality, more recently. She has given me permission to reprint her father's story. [I have added a few explanatory notes in square brackets.]

"My father was born in Church Cottages in 1911." [They are the cottages opposite the gate to the Parish Church and next to Well House, which was the Church Bakery.] "His name was Edward (Ted) Raines. After he finished school he worked for JJ Clayson, the builder."

"During the war he was in the fire service, stationed at Lyminge fire station." [The fire station was next to the Elham Rural District Council offices, which are now Age UK (Age Concern).] But, he was not just a fireman; as a tradesman, with his own tools, he undertook war work. One of his jobs was to find a bungalow on the shore at Dymchurch. Having found an empty property, his orders were to completely gut it and leave it as an empty shell. He was to only work at night, be away by daybreak and leave no evidence externally that he had been there. This became part of Operation Pluto (Pipe-Lines Under The Ocean). The empty shell was converted into a pumping station for a pipeline from Dungeness across the marshes to Dymchurch. Under the shingle, the pipeline went under the English Channel to Ambleteuse in Pas-De-Calais. This pipeline had the code name Dumbo."

"The second job is a bit of a mystery and maybe someone locally might have the answer to what he was doing. He had to find a large house in Folkestone. He was given the powers to requisition a house if he could not find an empty one. He found a house along The Leas. He had to make it habitable and secure for a group of telephonists who had been trained somewhere not known. They manned an exchange set up inside the Folkestone fire station. Who were these girls that had to have this house? What were they doing inside the fire station? I did wonder if it was a Y station for Bletchley Park? Bletchley did have a listening station in Folkestone but it was at Capel-le-Ferne and the girls that manned that lived with local families. There is an end to this story. Later in the war my father was driving a lorry of sand up the Road of Remembrance. Then, this house was hit [by enemy action]. He drove along and heard a girl screaming upstairs. He ran up and found her sitting in the bath, which was now full of debris. He pulled her out and put her over his shoulder. Always the gentleman, he took his tin hat off and put it over her bottom and ran back down the stairs, which were now on fire. He drove her back to the fire station took her into the exchange and said I think this is one of yours."

"How are you getting on with the ghosts of Lyminge? My Father used to tell the tale of the 'Ghost' of Lyminge Church Yard. As a young man, it must have been about 1930, he was walking home one evening along the path that runs along side the church yard, when a body rose up from one of the graves. He had not run so fast home to Church Cottage before. After a while, he saw an old woman walk out of the church gate. Next morning he told his Mother what he saw. She told him that it was the old lady from North Lyminge who often went and lay on her husband's grave in the evening.


