#### District Councillors Report - January 2017

#### From your District Councillors

We were very pleased to see the new gateway in place at the entrance to Lyminge (Etchinghill end) with replacement picket fences, new signs and a new tarmac surface to a section of pavement between the village and the doctors' surgery. The funding came from Shepway District Council and the work was done by Kent Highways.

The new gateway was part of our project to improve the appearance of the district and as part of this scheme we have also been able to help Etchinghill Residents Association with their plans for a village sign in the centre of Etchinghill. The design picks up themes from around the village including the golf course and should be an attractive addition to the village.

Shepway's Community Chest recently awarded grants totalling around £90,000 to community projects across the district including one to the Elham Valley Line Trust in nearby Peene for an outdoor learning centre. (If you haven't yet visited the Elham Valley Line Trust please do. Run by volunteers it has remarkable collection of railway memorabilia, the model railway of the Eurotunnel terminal, a duck pond, a café, a playground and a craft centre in the 17th century barn relocated from Danton Pinch when the Channel Tunnel was built. Look on line for opening times.)

Central government funding for local authorities is continuing to reduce as part of efforts to balance the nation's finances and this funding will cease entirely in 2020. Local government will then be entirely reliant on income raised locally from council tax and business rates (subject to a complicated formula to share variations across the country). You can see more details about our budget either on the website or in the latest edition of Shepway Today which you should have received in December. A large chunk of the savings we need to make next financial year will come from automating and streamlining the way we deal with benefit payments. There will be discussion and debate at the council on the budget before it is finally agreed in February (we must by law set a balanced budget).

We both enjoyed the St Nicholas Fayre on 03 December held in St Mary and St Ethelburga church and Jenny attended the Age UK Hythe & Lyminge Christmas Fair on 25 November. Susan performed the Christmas light switch on at Etchinghill on 27 November which is an event that seems to get bigger every year just like the Christmas tree at Meriden Park.

Consultation meetings on Otterpool Park started in December with events in Sellindge, Lympne, Hythe and Folkestone and there will be many more to come over the next few years. There's a special section on the Shepway website where you can see the key public documents about the project or you can contact us. We have written to Alan Kyte of Postling to arrange a meeting and are happy to hear from any other constituents who would like to raise issues with us.

We wish you a Happy and Peaceful New Year.

Rainfall for November slightly more than that for combined August/September & October. First frost on 18/11/16 gave us longer than usual 'frost free' season, with last frost on 01/05/16. Good for the garden - my summer bedding plants stayed in bloom until 01/12/16. High gust of wind coincided with lowest barometer reading of this millennium.

# Things-To-Do in January to Get Your Garden Ready for the Garden Safari, 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> June

- 1. Plant your pot grown Christmas tree
- 2. Buy seeds early buy anything that takes your fancy before the spring rush.
- 3. Look out for plug plants these small bedding plants offer great value for money, and are available early in the year. Pot them up and grow them on before planting outside after the risk of frost.
- 4. Decide on a colour theme give your garden a
  designer look in 2017 by colour theming your containers
  and accessories. Plan ahead so you can keep your eyes
  peeled for things that fit in with your scheme.
- 5. Clean and service tools get your tools up to scratch so they're in tip-top shape when the gardening season gets in full swing or browse our range in-store. Petrol mowers will benefit from a professional service.
- 6. Move plants if you are planning on moving any plants
  in your garden it's best to do it now when they're fairly
  dormant, before they put on lots of spring growth.
- $\hbox{\bf 7. Design new borders -} \ \hbox{\bf get creative and plan new}$

- borders. Use the traditional method, and take pencil to paper to work out perfect plant combinations for the New Year.
- **8. Tidy your borders** cut back and clear dead foliage and the last of any fallen leaves. Take care not to damage emerging roots.
- 9. Check and firm in all newly planted shrubs and trees
- **10. Check dahlia tubers**, gladioli and begonia corms that are being stored and remove any that are rotting
- **11. Spot water containers,** pots, tubs and window boxes if necessary
- **12. Remove snow** from evergreen trees and shrubs
- **13. Plant** new fruit bushes when the ground is not too wet or frozen
- 14. Check and loosen tree ties, replace any that are
- 15. Check stakes on fruit trees for being loose or broken
- 16. Keep off lawns in frosty weather
- 17. Have the lawn mower serviced and the blades sharpened
- **18. If puddles stay on the lawn**, spike with a garden fork or aerator to aid drainage
- 19. Prune Vines now before sap rises
- 20. Keep an area of the pond free of ice to help fish to breathe
- 21. Clean and oil all garden tools



## Lyminge a history Part Eight Reviewed by Nigel Thomas

[The Lyminge Historical Society has published part eight of Lyminge a history – this time in full colour. As with previous volumes, Nigel Thomas has provided an independent review so that you can gain an insight of the volume. The Newsletter has kindly reproduced this review here which will be spread over two issues.]

Lyminge seems a perfect mine of recoverable history. Mind you, it needs a dedicated team of accomplished delvers to discover and present it, and part eight of the village history is a superbly complementary testament to both the mine and the diggers. The topics are varied, but the common bonds between them are the loving care that informs the presentation and the determination to make each page interesting. I would love to have eavesdropped on the pre-publication discussions! The experience of the book is greatly enhanced by the use of more coloured photographs and artwork – you turn the pages with a pleasant sense of expectation.



I enjoyed the article on Davison's Mill at Stelling Minnis. In the past, windmills were often the hub of much village life and it was good to see how the working mill has now been made a lively source of historical information.

One of the great skills of the historian is to turn old documents into a lively and relevant read. As someone who knew some of the farming characters along the Elham Valley who were involved in the tithe wars of the 1930s, when some farmers refused to pay the demanded tithes, I found Duncan Harrington's article on Lyminge Tithes fascinating. Reading of the fiendish complications involved in ending the tithes, I was irresistibly reminded of the problems ahead as we unravel our links with the European Union. But that is an undoing of a different history!

The account of the workings of the Elham Poor Law Union by Deborah Collins trolled through a whole range of documents and was equally concerning. It revealed a range of human predicaments and interesting applications of the prevailing patterns of morality. The dominant mode was concern but it was often tinged by the litmus test of "the deserving poor": the ill child who was denied further relief because the character of the mother "was not good", and the delicious report from the Ladies' committee that young children should "be kept in a room apart from the adults and so be saved from the evil of hearing all the conversation that must be necessarily bad for them."

"They will advise you on buying over-the-counter medicine and give advice on prescribed medication. Many pharmacies are open for longer hours than GP surgeries, and you don't need an appointment."

Dr Bryant added: "If a pharmacist can't help you, they will be able to direct you to the right place, whether that is your GP, practice nurse, or a minor injuries unit. Many pharmacies now have consulting rooms people can discuss their problems with the pharmacist in private."

Pharmacies also offer health improvement services such as stop smoking and weight management. The push to use pharmacists comes in the midst of the winter season of coughs and colds. Dr Bryant said: "The best treatment for a cold is to drink fluids, take paracetamol and rest. Antibiotics don't work against viral infections such as colds and will not be prescribed by your doctor."


