

District Councillors' Update - April 2020



The situation with coronavirus (Covid 19) is moving very rapidly so for the most up to date information it is best to look on-line or listen to local radio. Both your District and County Council have business continuity plans to ensure that services are still delivered particularly to the most vulnerable. As a community we are sure that villagers will be looking out for their neighbours. It would be a kindness to ring those who need to self-isolate for a chat and to see if they need extra help.

The council has been very active in efforts to support our local High Streets with a £3m fund for grants of between £5,000 and £50,000 to cover up to 50% of a project. Folkestone town centre will benefit from £2.2 million of the fund with the remaining £800,000 being allocated across the district. 13 grants totalling £256,183 have been made so far. It's in all our interests that the local towns have a thriving centre and, whilst we want everyone to support the village shops, we know that people need a wider range of shops and entertainment than a village can support. We are therefore pleased to report that the District Council has made an accepted offer for the former Debenhams store in Folkestone. The council was already working on plans for the future of the Debenhams site which is a key part of the shopping area in Folkestone. It is a very large building with space for both leisure and retail. It would also make a good location for a medical centre and discussions are ongoing with the local Health Service.

Your District Council has the unpleasant task of dealing with fly-tipping. Analysis of what's dumped invariably finds over 90% of it could be taken free of charge to a Household Waste Recycling Centre. We know as well that most fly-tipping is done by criminals who advertise waste clearance services (Man with a Van etc) with no intention of taking the waste for proper disposal. Together with Kent Police and with extra funding from KCC, efforts have been stepped up to catch fly-tippers.

A recent success was the sentencing of Rodney Matthews of St Mary's Bay to 26 weeks in prison for 5 separate incidents of dumping waste from London in Dymchurch, Swingfield, Wootton and Hawkinge. Matthews' vehicle was also seized.

On 02 March we attended the event to announce the 20 commissioned works for the 2020 Folkestone Triennial which has the theme 'The Plot'. It's free to see between 05 September and 08 November and is supported by the District Council and KCC. We also both helped with Speedwatch in Lyminge on 13 March (just 3 vehicles recorded at 35mph) and we visited Age UK and were pleased to hear that work is progressing on the replacement of the roof.

We may not now be able to meet with people as easily as before but you are welcome to contact us by email or phone.

Finally, the elections for Kent's Police and Crime Commissioner that were due to take place on 07 May have been postponed till May 2021.

As a result of various injunctions by the Church of England, parish registers of baptisms, marriages and burials for each parish were supposed to have been kept from 1538. The surviving registers for Lyminge commence in 1544 for baptisms, 1665 for marriages and 1538 for burials. Fortunately beginning in 1598 every parish was required to make a copy of their register for that year and return it to the Archdeacon or Bishop. They are useful because they are meant to be exact copies, they can sometimes contain entries and valuable details which were left out from the original registers. However, in the Diocese of Canterbury the earliest transcripts start in 1558 stemming it would seem from the Articles of Enquiry sent out in 1559. Certainly Canon 70 of 1604 in Latin says towards the end, "And the churchwardens shall, once every year, within one month after the 25 March transmit unto the Bishop of the Diocese a true copy of the names of all persons, christened married and buried in their parish in the year before."

So, when Willis transcribed the Lyminge registers he was able to extract the marriages from 1564 to 1639. But the return for 1640 was not with the others as it was amongst the papers of Archbishop William Laud (1573-1645). Whilst Laud was held in the Tower of London William Prynne, one of his implacable enemies was ordered on the 31 May 1643 to seize the archbishop's papers for evidence against him in his impeachment. Document number 162 in the House of Lords Archive HL/PO/JO/10/1/11, swept up with many others by Prynne, is "A register of the marriage, christenings and burials for the parish of Limmage in the yeare of our Lord 1640". It is signed by Miles Barne Rector, William Slodden and John Ladd churchwardens. Miles Barne gained an MA from Trinity College Cambridge and was ordained in 1628. He was instituted by the bishop Abbot as Perpetual Vicar of Lyminge alias Lymedge with the chapels of Stanford and Paddlesworth on 22 December 1632. This was confirmed 24 October 1634 by Laud. By 20 February 1637 he is styled Rector. Miles was licensed as a preacher 22 April 1637 and Derek Ingram Hill says that he became a Six Preacher of Canterbury Cathedral 27 April 1663, but he signed the Act of Uniformity as a Six Preacher on 27 September 1662.



Update on the Big Anglo-Saxon Festival



Covid-19 is affecting us all. With 5 months to go until the start of the Big Anglo-Saxon Festival, we hope that things will be returning to normal by then, and people may actually want to get out and enjoy themselves. So at the moment, we are still planning for the festival to go ahead from 15-31 August. However, we recognise that we may have to take a different view as the weeks pass. We will keep this under review.

The first few of our festival fringe events were scheduled for May, but in the light of the current Government guidance, we have decided to postpone the first event, a workshop exploring natural dyes, to later in the year. We were also partnering with the Elham Valley Walking Festival to put on guided walks over the first two legs of the Royal Saxon Way, the new pilgrim route that we launched last year linking Folkestone to Minster in Thanet. The walking festival has now been cancelled, but we hope to be able to defer the walks until later in the year.




Coronavirus will affect many areas that are not getting publicity, and you may not think of. I'm starting off with the two below, please add others in future newsletters



HIGHWAYS

Your indomitable SPEEDWATCH team, ably led by past-councillor Colin Manvell has switched back into action mid March in Etchinghill, Rhodes Minnis and Lyminge. First reports show a considerable percentage of drivers at Rhodes Minnis exceeding 35 mph in the 30mph limit. More volunteers equals more data to present to Kent Police. If you are willing to give an hour of your time once a month, please contact the Clerk: details below.

Work continues with Highways and the appropriate officer at Folkestone & Hythe DC to try to tackle the dangerous 'head to head' situations in the stretch of Canterbury Road near the Post Office. We presently await details of the suggested plan from FHDC. Further details to follow.

Beachborough Hill through to New Barn Corner was closed at night from 16 March for what Kent Highways described as "large scale patching". The Council received very little advance notice to share with parishioners, but it's hoped that some improvement is noticeable. Highways are being urged to get on and resurface Canterbury Road and Station Road. Meanwhile, please continue to report potholes on the Kent Highways website.

THE YEAR AHEAD

The new Councillors who joined the Council last May are about to complete their first year of service to you, our community. As a Council we are working to formulate an over-arching plan to encompass our aims and ambitions for the Parish under the headings of:

The BUILT Environment (includes transport, highways and the formation of a Neighbourhood Plan)

The HISTORICAL Environment (promoting the rich heritage of our Parish)

The NATURAL Environment (improving biodiversity and responding to the Climate Change Emergency)

The SOCIAL Environment (making our Parish as inclusive and caring as possible for all age groups)

As a Council we place Communication, Partnership (and Governance) at the centre of our plans, working with groups across the Parish. Much was achieved by the previous body of councillors and the proposed plan will build on the firm foundations of the past. We hope to make a comprehensive presentation at a public meeting (subject to restrictions imposed by virtue of the coronavirus), more details in next month's magazine.

Meantime..... Cherri, our hardworking clerk continues to work through the "to do" list - the order has been placed for the new wooden PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE in Well Field but the state of the ground after such a wet winter could mean that work to fit the new bridge may not start for some time. We need a period of dry weather to stabilise the banks, but an exciting willow shelter has been planted to be enjoyed by young and old alike when the weather improves.

Tender documents have been sent to contractors for grounds maintenance. There will be small changes to the management of Well field and Court Lodge Green. Once quotations are in, details will be published.

ENVIRONMENT

You will see the piece concerned with recycling in the Climate Action Group pages this month. Claire Norman, a Lyminge Resident employed by Ashford Borough Council as an Education Officer in this field, gave an informative slide presentation at the March Finance & Administration Committee Meeting. Have your heard of TERRACYCLE? It is possible to recycle coffee pods, toothpaste tubes and all sorts of other items that cannot go in our standard recycling bins. At its meeting at the end of March, the full Council will consider purchasing and siting the appropriate bins to capture those items which are then recycled into play equipment, park benches and with a donation to a charity of choice.



Who we are...

Lyminge Climate Action is a growing community movement that emerged in 2019 from the Climate Emergency talks presented by Cllr Owen Standen. Several voluntary working groups are now tackling different aspects of the Climate Crisis at a local level. In these pages we aim to keep you abreast of what's going on and inspire you to join in.

Chancellor's Budget

Lyminge Climate Action (LCA) looks to tackle different aspects of the climate crisis at a local level but this can only be effective if we join up to the wider works happening across the UK. In the Chancellor's first Budget there is positive news to report, with significant capital funding being provided for;

- flood defense the budget doubles over the next six years, with a percentage going to local authorities to build their flood resilience.
- nature for climate an investment planting 30,000 hectares of trees, restoring peatland, as well as a £25m fund for nature recovery and pollinators.
- air quality investment in capital over the next two years to combat roadside pollution, enabling local authorities to take steps to reduce nitrogen dioxide emissions.

..... these are all in line with the projects that the LCA are planning for 2020 – 2021.

This Budget is being seen as a step in the right direction with projects such as the establishing of two or more carbon capture clusters by 2030, creating 6,000 jobs in green technology. There is a lot more that needs to be done but we also need to find the positives.

Waste Sector Reforms

The waste sector reforms outlined investment to combat fly-tipping and begin work on an Expanded Producer Responsibility Scheme, designed to encourage producers to make their packaging more recyclable and reduce the amount of unnecessary packaging. We clearly welcome this needed reduction in waste but as this is still only in the planning stages the LCA's Education Group want to share with you what we can currently recycle from your household waste through your households recycling collection scheme in Lyminge:

WHICH BIN TO USE?

- a. Purple Lid Recycling Bin
 - Clean cans
 - Tins
 - Glass jars and bottles
 - Empty aerosol cans
 - Clean tin foil
 - Plastic containers

No plastic bags, wrappers or black sacks.

Recycling must be loose and rinsed out if possible.

b. Black Box

- Clean paper
- Cardboard

No paper/card with a metallic or glitter finish or tissue paper

c. Green Food Caddy

- Food waste,raw or cooked
- Tea bags and coffee grounds

You can use compostable liners or paper (e.g. newspaper or kitchen roll) to line your caddy if you want to. Don't use plastic bags. You can buy food caddy liners made from corn starch or paper from most supermarkets and hardware shops.

Please put everything that can be recycled into the right bin, otherwise the crew won't pick it up. Folkestone and Hythe District Council's current recycling rate is 48%.

- Garden waste
- Hedge trimmings
- Weeds, flowers and plants





Bulky Waste collection service

The council offers a bulky waste collection service for domestic properties. They collect and dispose of fridges, freezers, cookers, lawnmowers, mattresses and many other items.









DID YOU KNOW?

Refuse waste in Kent is now sent to a 'waste for energy' plant, rather than to landfill.

Health Notes related to Coronavirus Infection:

Stay at home if you have coronavirus symptoms

- a high temperature you feel hot to touch on your chest or back
- a new, continuous cough this means you've started coughing repeatedly
- Do not go to a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital.
- You do not need to contact 111 to tell them you're staying at home.
- Testing for coronavirus is not needed if you're staying at home.

How long to stay at home

- if you have symptoms, stay at home for 7 days
- if you live with other people, they should stay at home for 14 days from the day the first person got symptoms
- If you live with someone who is 70 or over, has a long-term condition, is pregnant or has a weakened immune system, try to find somewhere else for them to stay for 14 days.
- If you have to stay at home together, try to keep away from each other as much as possible.

Read our advice about staying at home.

Urgent advice: Use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service if:

- you feel you cannot cope with your symptoms at home
- your condition gets worse
- your symptoms do not get better after 7 days

How to avoid catching and spreading coronavirus (social distancing)

Everyone should do what they can to stop coronavirus spreading. It is particularly important for people who:

- are 70 or over
- have a long-term condition

Do:

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- always wash your hands when you get home or when you get into work
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
- avoid close contact with people who have symptoms of coronavirus
- only travel on public transport if you need to
- work from home, if you can
- avoid social activities, such as going to pubs, restaurants, theatres and cinemas
- avoid events with large groups of people
- use phone, online services, or apps to contact your GP surgery or other NHS services

Don't

- do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean
- do not have visitors to your home, including friends and family

The NHS will contact you from Monday 23 March 2020 if you are at particularly high risk of getting seriously ill with coronavirus. You'll be given specific advice about what to do. Do not contact your GP or healthcare team at this stage – wait to be contacted.
