District Councillors' Update - December 2020



Events can move very quickly so it's best to check on www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk for the latest information on services. The call centre number is 01303 853000 and if you get

stuck you can always contact one of us.

During the second lockdown, your District Council reestablished community hubs to help with shopping, meals, dog walking, etc for those who needed help.

The District Council is dealing with Government grants for businesses forced to close by law or adversely impacted by this second lockdown. To find out more go to folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/local-restrictions-support and complete the application form. We know people have been concerned about the level of reported fraud nationally for such schemes and we'd like to reassure residents that claims are properly checked. It's been heartening to see how quickly the grants have been paid to businesses in need even with the necessary checks.

Our district has one of the lowest infection rates in the country but it was rising sharply in line with other parts of the country so there is a real need for us to continue with social distancing, hand washing and the wearing of masks (unless exempt).

As we write, the planning officers are still evaluating the comments they have received on the planning application for 28 homes (including 6 affordable) by Pentland Properties for the land behind Broadstreet House in Lyminge. If the officers recommend approval the final decision will then be taken by the councillors on the Planning Committee. Although the formal deadline for comments has passed they will still be accepted and taken into consideration up to the date of the committee which meets every three weeks (the next meetings are 15 December and 19 January). The application number to quote when making comments is 20/1397/FH.

Like you, we miss all our usual village events but we are continuing to attend the online meetings of Lyminge Parish Council and Susan took part in the Etchinghill Residents Association Zoom quiz on 30 October to raise money for more Christmas lights.

We wish you all in Lyminge, Rhodes Minnis, Etchinghill and Postling a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. 
The Royal Saxon Way ("RSW") is a new walking route created as part of the Pathways to the Past project. It runs for some 36 miles from coast to coast between Folkestone and Minster-in-Thanet, crossing the grain of the North Downs via Lyminge and the Elham Valley. There is also a shorter circular route of 16 miles that returns from Lyminge to Folkestone via Paddlesworth.

The main RSW links together 24 historic churches, including 16 active parish churches. Unusually, at either end the ancient parish church at Folkestone and the abbey at Minster preserve relics of their original Anglo-Saxon royal saints: St Eanswythe and St Mildreth. At Lyminge, the Anglo-Saxon church uncovered in 2019 was founded by St Ethelburga and had its own shrine, dedicated to St Eadburg. There are other historic churches with Anglo-Saxon origins along the route, so we see the whole walk as a celebration of the powerful Anglo-Saxon queens and princesses who founded these churches and abbeys that still survive today, and who were significant figures in the politics of the time. This is why we have called it the Royal Saxon Way.

The route is a rich and varied land, river and seascape. From the coast it follows the valleys of the Enbrook and Seabrook up to Etchinghill, and then from Lyminge follows the Nailbourne which joins the Little Stour which then flows into the Great Stour that passes Minster.







This year has been difficult for many of us and we are hoping 2021 will be better for everyone. Stay safe and please continue to follow Government advice to help project us all against Covid-19.

We would also like to express our thanks to all NHS staff and key workers, Age UK and volunteers across the parish who have worked so hard over the last year and continue to provide such vital support for us all.

GRANTS FOR COMMUNITY GROUPS

The Parish Council is keen to encourage village organisations, clubs and societies. We believe they contribute very much to making our community a great place to live. That is why each year we set aside some of our income from the Council Tax to fund grants to community groups. After months of lock-down that have restricted and mostly stopped normal activities, we know that many village groups are short of income. If your group is suddenly facing an unexpected bill that is difficult to meet, we would encourage you to consider whether the Parish Council is able to help.



Normally, we offer help with capital expenditure – one-off costs that are not expected to recur.

Also, as a general principle, we do not cover more than 50% of the expected

cost, so you will always need to find some money from somewhere else. To give an idea of the sort of things we support, over the past year or so, we have helped a number of groups, such as:

- Lyminge Scouts a new hot water system in the Scout Hut;
- Etchinghill Residents Association new lights for the Christmas Tree
- Lyminge Village Hall CCTV for the village hall
- Pathways to the Past Project information panels to be erected at archaeological sites in the village

There is guidance to explain how to fill it in, and If you have any problems, you can also speak to the Parish Clerk before submitting the form. If you want your application considered quickly, please make sure that you complete the form fully, and supply all the supporting documents requested.

If you would like to tell us more about why you need the money, you can also come and speak to councillors at the Council meeting when your request will be considered. The Clerk will be able to confirm when this will be, and the location. At the moment, we are meeting remotely by Zoom, and you will be allowed up to 15 minutes to speak, if you want to do so.

Having a Sustainable Christmas

Every year 10 million tonnes of food in the UK goes into landfill, with a third of this coming from our own homes. Christmas time is no exception, with people often buying in extra food to cater for others. Waste management company Biffa says that, staggeringly, 2m turkeys, 74m mince pies and 17.2m sprouts are thrown away every Christmas. This wasted food makes a significant contribution to global warming, and the good news is that there are lots of easy things we can do to change this. Here are our Top Tips for a greener Christmas, while many of these are relevant all year round:

- Plan your meals and only buy what you need to avoid surplus that is wasted
- Look for food with less plastic packaging where possible, and take your own bags and containers
- Use up leftovers the next day, or freeze any surplus that can be frozen
- Buy seasonal foods that can be produced locally sprouts and parsnips are staples of the Christmas dinner for a reason!
- Consider vegetarian or vegan dishes to reduce meat intake or look for organic, or locally-produced meat where possible, supporting smaller-scale farms



Top 5 Tips to make this Christmas the greenest one yet!

- 1. It's true that most wrapping paper can actually be recycled...but only if it's not the shiny and glittery type. If you want to know if the wrapping paper can be recycled or not, use the scrunch test. Scrunch up the paper in your hands and then let it go. If the paper stays scrunched up then it can be recycled but, if it unfolds by its own accord, then it likely contains non-recyclable materials. You can always opt for plain brown paper or gift bags as these can be used more than once.
- 2. Make your own Christmas decorations. Foraging for pine cones and holly is the perfect excuse to enjoy the great outdoors and keep kids busy. Check out some ideas at https://www.hobbycraft.co.uk/christmas
- 3. A staggering 1.5 billion Christmas cards are thrown away by UK households each year. Why not try giving people a call to wish them goodwill instead of sending a card. If a card is needed, try to find ones made from recycled materials and not containing too much shiny glitter
- 4. When it comes to selecting gifts, why not opt for making your own presents. Whether you love baking, sewing or painting, why not get creative this season. Best of all, the receiver will find joy in the gift long after the decorations have come down
- 5. Use the annual gastronomic extravaganza as an opportunity to show your support for some brilliant local producers. Sourcing your meats and vegetables locally is a good place to start: you'll use fewer food miles, less packaging and you can feel confident that you have supported local small businesses.

Final Tip: Eat the food in your freezer in the run-up to the main event, leaving plenty of room for leftovers. Surplus turkey and ham can be sliced, then wrapped in parchment and frozen. You can even freeze leftover Stilton and save it to use in a warming winter soup.

_ heads. Goldfinches attracted them. According to the RHS there are at least 15 other names for this plant, including Adam's Flannel! They are popular for part of floral arrangements and there is even a diet supplement made from teasel extract! The red berries

here are on a Mountain Ash or Rowan ~ [Sorbus aucuparia] Another plant that is valuable for wildlife. The berries are usually redder than shown here but the frost seems to have dimmed their colour. The tree also has a reputation for being the bane of witches!
