

#### District Councillors Update - January 2020

After a General Election with just about every political party committing to major housebuilding (Labour 250,000 a year, Liberal Democrats 300,000 a year, Greens 100,000 a year) we have a Conservative Government which is also committed to new homes. It's just as well your District Council has been planning for our share of the growth that will be needed whoever won the election. The Places and Policies Local Plan for our area has now had several rounds of public consultation and been examined in public by an Independent Planning Inspector. The Inspector required that the District Council identify a site/s for gypsy and traveller pitches. A suitable site for 4 pitches was identified in Old Romney and this has been consulted on and agreed by the Inspector. This means the final draft of the Plan with the Inspector's changes can be issued for one last chance for comment by those (and only those) who submitted comments last time. The whole process should be complete by May 2020.

A fully approved Local Plan gives our district protection from speculative development and gives certainty to communities and good developers. We are also fortunate to have a very large share of the new housing and employment sites met by the new Garden Town at Otterpool Park. Earlier this year the District Council acquired Westenhanger Castle which borders the new town. The castle, its sixteenth century barn and 14 acres of parkland will form an integral part of the Garden Town. An Open Day was held on 30 November for residents of our district to visit the castle. As the castle has been in private ownership for many years, this was the first time many local people had had the opportunity to see inside. Around 350 people took part in the Open Day and we hope to have more such events in 2020.

We are also pleased to report that at our council meeting on 20 November the funding for future development of Otterpool Park was agreed.

Jenny attended the AGM of Age UK Hythe & Lyminge. The new Dementia areas, particularly in Lyminge have been very well received and have attracted many clients. However, there is capacity to take more people and local residents are encouraged to visit to see the services on offer, which also include delivery of meals. The shops at both the centres are open Monday to Friday 9am - 3.30pm AND on Saturday mornings from 9.30am - 12.30pm. Volunteers are always welcome and details can be found on the website.

We were both able to attend Postling Parish Council meeting on 27 November and Susan was at the excellent Carol Concert at Lyminge church on 11 December. As is now a tradition, Susan switched on the Christmas lights at Etchinghill on 01 December and, despite the rain, many villagers turned out to enjoy mulled wine and sing carols with the Shepway Brass band.

It sometimes happens that individuals, by their actions, donate their surnames to the language as uncapitalised everyday words, as in 'sandwich', 'wellington' and 'boycott'. Another such word is 'spoonerism', defined by Chambers Dictionary as "a transposition of initial sounds of spoken words - eg 'shoving leopard' for 'loving shepherd'- derivation from **Rev WA Spooner**...a noted perpetrator."

William Archibald Spooner was, for over sixty years, a member of New College, Oxford, first as a scholar, then Fellow, and finally Warden from 1903 to 1924. He was a tiny albino, with an unusually large head and pale blue eyes. William Hayter wrote that "All his life, Spooner looked like a white-haired baby. His appearance hardly changed."

**Spooner** was, in his own words, never more than "a moderately useful man" and, arguably, would have remained unnoticed save for the spoonerisms. Many of these, such as 'tasted a whole worm', 'hissed my mystery lectures', and 'half-warmed fish', are now regarded as apocryphal, invented by undergraduates and colleagues to tease their beloved 'Spoo', although he did once admit to announcing a hymn as 'Kinquering Kongs'.

Of more lasting interest are the well-documented examples of Spooner's transpositions of ideas. After a puzzling sermon, he remounted the pulpit to say, "In the sermon I have just preached, whenever I said Aristotle, I meant St Paul." Eleanor Jourdain recalled that once, at dinner, Spooner upset a salt-cellar and then dripped claret on the salt "until he had produced the purple mound which would have been the end-product if he had spilled claret...and had then cast a heap of salt on the pool to absorb it."

Spooner died peacefully in 1930. For epitaph, we need only his words, comparing his misattributions with those of Homer and Shakespeare: "I err in very good company."

**Exploring the Legacy of Ethelburga** 

#### The Big Anglo-Saxon Festival is coming!



We are still developing ideas for a two week festival at the end of August to celebrate the great Anglo-Saxon heritage of Lyminge. We had excellent support at our drop-in sessions in December and we are now working with a number of village groups to put



ideas into practice. If you are involved with a community group, would be interested in hosting an event during the festival, and still haven't got in touch, there is still time. Please contact the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership, who are managing the festival on behalf of the Pathways to the Past project.

A budget is available for event costs and we will be happy to help you with ideas and the production of a proposal. Ideas could link arts and crafts, music, poetry, drama, food, sporting matches, talks, walks and workshops with Lyminge's rich Anglo-Saxon past. We are looking to combine these events with other activities. We have already booked a wild cooking workshop, have plans for a natural dying workshop, and we can confirm that Øst Centingas, the re-enactment group, will be making a welcome return.

If you would like to be involved, please call Iona, Mel or Flora at White Cliffs Countryside Partnership on 01304 241806. Some people have been asking about the new paths in the churchyard. Unfortunately, the bad weather defeated us. We need an extended period of dry weather to lay the new top surface. At least for the time being, we can use the aggregate sub-base that has been laid. Apologies for the delay, but we are confident the new paths will be worth waiting for.

Don't forget too that 'Diary of a Dig', an account of the archaeological dig in the church yard during the summer is still on sale, at the Library and from Sunny Cottage, Canterbury Road (behind the Coffee Cabin). This edition (January 2020) marks another major milestone in the history of The Lyminge Newsletter. Much of its success is down to the dedication and commitment of Adrian (Willcox) who has tirelessly been responsible for its printing over the past 43 years. We would all like to record our indebtedness for his dogged determination month-on-month to deliver a newsletter of which we can be truly proud, with the numbers now reaching 1600+ copies. I have asked Adrian to record a potted-history of newsletter which is printed below.

#### The Lyminge Newsletter.....

As many of you know the Association celebrates its 50th Anniversary this year.

A few years after the Association formed it was decided to have a village Newsletter, which by 1976 was put together by Mrs. Houlahan and printed by Mr Hart, whose secretary typed it all, in Elham. In July of that year it was suggested that the Association purchase its own duplicator. By September such a machine was bought and the Lyminge Duplicating Service was set up and running, operated by the then Mrs Willcox. The accounts for 1977 show that it cost just £50. Now the Newsletter was produced completely in the parish of Lyminge, as it would be for the next 43 years. In its first year the Duplicating Service made enough profit to cover over half of the Newsletter costs. The machine used to sit on the floor of the dining area in our then small bungalow!

Sadly I have not been able to track down any copies of these very first Newsletters nor can I find out, [or remember!] how many were produced each month. Originally, it appears that entries were free as the Minutes of the June 1977 committee meeting show some discussion on the possibility of charging for entries at 2p for 10 words.

Various people have taken on the mantle of Editor over the years and the Newsletter gradually expanded taking in advertising for local firms and charging a very small amount for advertising village societies' events. All this provided an income for the Association which then had funds to help existing societies with their projects and to help new groups get started. By 1981 the Duplicating Service was able to produce the programme for Lyminge Day that year. [Lyminge Day was originally started and organised by The Lyminge Association.] 1982 saw the first Deliverers' Tea Party.

Over the next decade or so the Newsletter and the Duplicating Service expanded with the acquisition of a new more efficient electric Roneo duplicator. Work was done for many village clubs and also quite a number of commercial firms had job sheets and forms produced by the Service. Through the 80s and 90s the Service continued with various electronic typewriters that could produce different print styles and the Newsletter became a little more stylish.

Then came the advent of the home computer and printer. This meant that the work from outside groups and businesses began to dry up. Fortunately the size of the Newsletter grew as it was attracting more entries and more advertising. The Newsletter now became the main source of income for the Association and the Duplicating Service closed down.

I had also operated the Association Duplicator and was then asked to print the now much bigger Newsletter on a slightly more commercial basis. At first this was done using my offset-litho printing press which I used for a part-time business. Now the origination could be done by desk-top publishing software and all sorts of typefaces and sizes could be incorporated. Later on, two much faster and economical Risograph machines were used as well for the printing side. Originally the Newsletter pages had been collated and stapled by hand, but now it was done by two collating machines.

#### Get your medicine cabinet fighting fit this winter in east Kent

Doctors in east Kent are reminding people to stock up their medicine cabinets ready for winter and the holiday periods.

Winter illnesses such as colds and coughs, sore throats, and upset stomachs can easily be treated at home with medicines available at low cost from your local pharmacy - no GP appointment or prescription required.

Dr Jonathan Bryant, Chair of NHS South Kent Coast Clinical Commissioning Group, said: "Planning ahead this winter will help us help you and your family stay healthy and avoid a last minute trip to the pharmacy or supermarket.

"It is important to make sure you have a well-stocked medicine cabinet at home which should include paracetamol, cold remedies, antiseptic wipes, plasters, tweezers and a thermometer.

"If you take prescribed medication make sure you order enough from your GP surgery to last you over the holiday breaks, as many GPs and pharmacies will close and remember to take it with you when if you go away."

Get advice from your pharmacist at the first sign of feeling ill – don't wait for it to get more serious. They will be happy to talk to you about a cough or a cold and can sell a range of medication without the need for a prescription.

Dr Bryant added: "If you urgently need medical care when your GP practice is closed, and the pharmacy can't help, please ring NHS 111 for advice. They can arrange for you to see an out-of-hours GP service if necessary, and they are open 24 hours a day every day of the week."

Local pharmacies will be open on bank holidays, and to find them, people can use Health Help Now which is available on the web at www.healthhelpnow.nhs.uk or it can be downloaded from the Google Play and the App Store.

#### **HAPPY NEW YEAR**

All Councillors and Cherri our Clerk wish you all a Happy and Peaceful and GREEN New Year. As you can see, the Council has the newly formed centrefold in the revamped magazine and we shall be using the extra space to bring you more news in greater detail of all the matters affecting our lovely parish.

Environmental issues will feature EVERY month with updates from the various groups formed following the Climate Emergency Meeting that was held in the summer. If you have not signed up to join a group and wish to do so, please see the advertisement elsewhere for the next group meeting on 24 January 7 p.m. at Lyminge Village Hall

#### 2020/21 BUDGET & PRECEPT

At the end of the year important budget planning took place with a view to fully funding projects and other commitments that council must meet over the 2020/21 period. The council resolved to fund the projected budget in full from the Parish precept, without resorting to reserves (half of which are unallocated in accordance with legal requirements and half being already allocated for projects), which will result in a precept increase of approx. 0.25p per week for a band D property.

#### Some of the projects currently in progress.....

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AROUND THE POST OFFICE - Following helpful meetings with our local Highways Officer, it has been agreed that ALL pre existing signs and red strips painted on the highway will be refreshed from Highways' budget (hurrah!). In addition, warning signs to SLOW will be painted on the highway on the approach to the shop from each direction. Additional '30' roundels will be painted on the highways in Lyminge at points where complaints about speeding have been highlighted. This work should be tackled during the first week of January (weather permitting). No road closures are envisaged, just traffic light controls.

The second phase of work in the vicinity of the shop is slightly more complicated (and expensive for the Council as the cost would fall to us.) We are currently taking advice from our District Councillor on the next steps. Watch this space!

Elsewhere in the parish – existing signs and red strips painted on the highway in Etchinghill will be refreshed at no cost to the Council. At Rhodes Minnis, it is hoped that new '30' roundels can be added to the highway either side of the crossroads at the top of Longage Hill.

If speeding vehicles is a matter of concern to you and you have an hour a month to give as a volunteer, then please consider joining SPEEDWATCH! The more data we can submit to Kent Police the better — the more teams we have in action, the more data that is produced! Please contact the Clerk in the first instance, who will put you in touch with the local Speedwatch Co-ordinator.

TREE SURVEY – A survey of the trees in Well and Tayne Field has been provided to the Council and a cycle of work will be introduced as recommended. More trees will be planted to maintain the screen between the field and the back gardens of the houses in Station Road.

BRIDGE ON WELL FIELD – We are presently considering the maintenance plan for Well Field which will dictate whether a smaller mower can be used to maintain the area. This would mean that the current bridge could be replaced with a footbridge rather than a much more expensive one capable of taking the weight of a larger gang mower.

PLAY EQUIPMENT – Around the parish some of the play equipment is coming towards the end of its life and provision has been made in the budget to repair/replace where necessary (ROSPA provide us with a detailed report each year and identifies those items requiring attention). Some of the adult gym equipment on Jubilee Field will be replaced where it is not economical to repair. Similarly, the running track is receiving attention to make this safe to use through the winter months.

#### **BECOME A COUNCILLOR!**

At the end of last year we regretfully accepted the resignation of ClIr Drew Elliott-Cook who has had to step down from the role of councillor to focus on other commitments and we would like to thank Drew for all his hard work and commitment during his time on the council. This means that we now have a vacancy for a new councillor to join us. If you are interested in the role, please do contact either the Clerk or Chair for more information or an informal chat to learn more about the role. The deadline for applications is Friday 28<sup>th</sup> February.

Over the last couple of months a momentum is starting to build within our local boundaries, actually on our very own doorsteps. Groups of people have started self-organising and taking action to positively impact local Climate and enhance our Community.

#### **\*** What does this look like?

Through encouraging discussion and supporting ideas we are considering how to create a low carbon. In doing so we have found that we have real skills and knowledge locally that can yield significant opportunities. These are to coordinate actions that can help deliver on a range of local priorities, improving health outcomes, enhancing the natural environment and strengthening local community and this is just the start.

#### \* The thinking so far?

This has been based on identifying and advocating the changes we want to see in our community. Our ambition now is to be more representative and work on a widest possible section of ideas, local concerns and perspectives. We can do this by having the community represented in full. For this to happen we need all ages, experience, interests and demographics represented. We would love to hear your views on how we can make this happen?

#### \* How do we work?

We model a networked and collaborative way of working; there is no hierarchy. We enable decision-making in a distributed way that ensures a shared voice across the collective community. It is the individuals within the different working groups that have the vision, commitment and drive to create these benefits and opportunities. The levels of support and encouragement being shown for each other already has been an incredible thing.

#### Why are we doing this?

The threat and urgency created by climate change is of a magnitude that it requires us to talk and act. We know that it will be important for us to tap into the skills, ideas, knowledge, passion, energy and become an agency of all in our community to address the issues. Conversation, dialogue and enquiry will be key activities in this process, but also to support each other in creating a more resilient, creative and forward-thinking local community. We will need to practice working together and in different ways and across boundaries to reflect the systemic nature of the situation. There is a need to redefine our relationship with our planet and its ecosystems. This all starts at a local level and can create positive opportunities for our community.
