The Editor has struggled year-on-year to get these invoices out in a timely fashion and the funds sent to the treasurer. This was highlighted this year when his holiday got in the way and we are still chasing a few outstanding accounts (if its YOU, please send them in ASAP. Unpaid ones will be removed from the August edition).

With the start of the new financial year (July 2020) we have put in place a new accounting system, WAVE, ably set-up by Janet and Martin Fry. Once in place, the invoices are sent out by email exactly when they are due. As before, payment can be made by BACs (you can do it from your own armchair but please note that




Meet the new landlord and landlady of The Coach & Horses

The Very FIRST Newsletter

After some considerable searching we have been able to locate a copy of the very first Lyminge Newsletter printed in November 1970.

In it is recorded the formation of The Lyminge Association with seventeen nominations for the nine vacancies, along with its Aims and Objectives and constitution. The formation of the Lyminge Historical Society was proposed as was the proposed publication of the Diary of Events to try alleviate any overlap of meetings and events. It is still found in the current newsletter, be it on hold, because of the current Covid19.

Bingo was used as a fund raiser and feelers were put out to see if there was any interest in a Film Society, Philatelic Society, Tennis Club and Debating Society. A Wine and Cheese Party was planned for later in the year along with a Lyminge Day planed for the following year.

To encourage and support cultural, sporting, recreational and educational activities in the village. 5. To record the history of the parish of Lyminge.

District Councillors' Update - July 2020

The District Council has been administering the Government grants to businesses to support them during the pandemic and we know that many local businesses, organisations and village halls have benefitted from this simple process and swift payment. However, not all traders were eligible and there is now a new fund designed to help those who missed out on the first tranche of the Government's Covid-19 financial support programme. The District Council approved 22 applications totalling £185,000 in June, with a further £1m of the funding available. A further 50 applications are being assessed and we encourage any small business which has not yet applied to do so online now.



The Hythe Community Hub led by Age UK Hythe & Lyminge, continues to offer help, support and services to vulnerable residents in our villages. Please contact them on 01303 269602. There are three Community hubs serving our district and, together with the District Council, they are considering how to adapt their services as demand decreases but we are all mindful of a possible further peak and the need to be able to scale up very quickly. We would like to thank the 637 volunteers who have supported the three hubs as well as all of you who have been good neighbours to those who've needed help during lockdown.

Every year the District Council conducts a canvass of all homes to make sure the electoral register is accurate. One difference this year is that the information on the electoral register will be cross checked against records held by the Department for Work and Pensions. The District Council will start contacting people from 01 July by email (if they have these contact details) or by post if they do not. If anything is unclear then the Electoral Services Team can be contacted at 01303 853497 or ask one of us.

We attended both the Postling and Lyminge parish council meetings held on Zoom on 27 May with the Postling meeting finishing just moments before the Lyminge meeting started. Similarly we are attending council meetings both formal and the day to day business meetings online. We continue to be available by email or phone but we look forward to being able to take part in village events in person before long.

Letters To The Editor.....

A Subtle Uprising

What happened to the surge of colour we expected to see on the 'Bumpy Field' this spring following the rotavating of some areas and planting of wild flower seed last autumn?? Puter Barnes

Wildflowers on the 'bumpy field' has been a more subtle change than we first thought we would see, but diversification of species-poor grasslands can take a bit of time. Those of us that have been able to follow the changes closely, have seen some positive changes. Amongst the competition from established species, we have been delighted to see a steady drift of yellow flowers take hold. Yellow Rattle (Rhinanthus minor) is more than an attractive flower it is a management tool in the creation of a wildflower meadow. It is parasitic on grasses (the yellow rattle roots attach to grass roots and draw nutrients from them) and therefore decreases the grasses' productivity, giving wild flowers a chance to compete and gradually establish themselves.

Wildflower rich grasslands found on the south-east's chalk land are an important habitat and an attractive feature of the landscape. The decline in the area covered by these special grasslands has become a serious threat to biodiversity. In response to this we have started the process of changing the management so over time we create as much diversity as possible. Cutting has been delayed until October after all flowering is over and gone to seed. Spring cutting if needed should take place before the end of February as Yellow Rattle starts to germinate as mild weather comes in the spring. We know the land has had fertiliser put on it in the past and it will take time to reverse this impact. The new management will remove all cuttings to prevent nutrient build up, which can encourage competitive species and to prevent smothering of wildflower seedlings.

Pathways to the Past

Exploring the Legacy of Ethelburga

At long last the new paths have been laid throughout the church yard and it is fully open again. The new path surface is made from resin-bound aggregate in a mix of colours to complement the range in the church itself. This material is water-permeable so rain water will just drain through and it should resist icing in bad weather. We have fitted a new hand rail to the main path and scraped the path surface down to create a shallower and more even gradient. The Anglo-Saxon church is marked out in the newly enlarged paved area outside

the porch. There is a new path laid up to the War Memorial, completing the job begun 100 years ago. The line of walls from what we believe was the Archbishops' Palace is marked out in this. There is also a new path to the north door where we now have step-free access. Some more work is still required to repair the north door threshold, and there will be further work tidying up in the church yard before the work is complete. There are pictures in the Out and About section at the back of this Newsletter.

I am delighted to say that we are partnering with Councillor Owen Standen who has developed the management plan for Court Lodge Green ("the Bumpy Field"), to create a planting and management plan for the church yard too. Both areas together will create a wonderful large environmentally friendly corridor leading from the open countryside into the heart of our village. The churchyard provides a link to the equally large managed area of Well Field and Tayne Field, which similarly is now being actively managed for wildlife by the Parish Council.

Don't forget to keep up to date with the project on our website at geopaethas.com. We hope to be publishing an update on the 3D reconstructions soon and you will be able to see how work is progressing.

It's great to see the local efforts to make space for nature in our area. Tayne Field and Court Lodge Green are both looking more diverse than they were this time last year, and Lyminge churchyard is looking fabulous with the new paths winding through plenty of wild flowers. A big thanks to everyone involved in looking after these spaces that we hold dear. But who exactly is living in our wild places? Everyone can help us find out. We can all look out for wildlife, and share our observations of any plant or animal through wildlife recording schemes.

In the limited area I spend most of my time, basically between Court Lodge Green and Tayne Field, I have recorded over 700 different species of animal in recent years, many of them since the coronavirus lockdown. This includes 55 bird species, with red kites added for the first time this year. Pollinators are particularly good indicators of the health of our local environment, and we have plenty here: so far I have found 23 different butterfly species, 43 bees, 26 hoverflies, and 390 moths. We have bees that look like wasps, flies that look like bees, and moths that look like twigs. We have wasps that live inside caterpillars, and caterpillars that live inside leaves. We have stickleback fish, and we have frogs and toads and lizards and snakes.

One animal I have never seen in Lyminge though is a hedgehog. If anyone sees one please do let us know – or better still, iRecord it. In fact it would be great if as many people as possible could use iRecord to let us know about any wildlife observations. iRecord is a national wildlife recording scheme, anyone can register and then submit wildlife records online, preferably accompanied with a photo for verification by experts – these records go straight to the national Biological Records Centre, and we can browse them to see what is living locally. Although I have recorded over 700 local animals, I am rubbish with plants, and would love to see people adding local plant records to iRecord, especially of plants in our communal green spaces.

Another good online scheme specifically for birds is eBird, although there is minimal verification of records so this is suitable only if you are confident of your identifications. On eBird there is an interactive and illustrated list of birds observed in Lyminge village, which anyone can add their observations to, and of course the same can be done for any other local sites.



Recording wildlife is very helpful, but clearly ensuring wildlife has a home is more important. In addition to the local work in our communal areas I've seen some wonderful efforts to give wildlife a home in private gardens – flowering lawns are one great way to provide space for wildlife, as of course are flower beds with native flowers, hedges of native trees/bushes, ponds, compost heaps, wood piles, bird and bat boxes, bee hotels, and so on. Avoiding pesticides and herbicides and other poisons is also important. Everyone can do something for wildlife, and if you can help record it then all the better. With a change in the latest Government guidance we would remind parishioners that our open spaces and sports facilities remain open for your unlimited use, however at the time of publishing, playparks still remain closed. The fine weather will tempt many people to resume going out and socialising but please remember that current guidelines only allow for group size of 6 people. Children's parties which do not meet these guidelines can not be held on our open spaces.

AND REMEMBER, PLEASE CLEAR UP AFTER YOUR DOG AND DON'T FORGET TO TAKE YOUR LITTER HOME. WE HAVE HAD NUMEROUS REPORTS OF DOG FOULING/HIGH LEVELS OF LITTERING. PLEASE USE THE BINS PROVIDED OR TAKE IT WITH YOU.

KENT HIGHWAYS

As soon as social distancing permits, we have requested work be carried out through Lyminge as a matter of urgency. Be aware though, this may be carried out at night, so some disturbance is possible. Kent Highways have been asked to give as much advance information as possible so that we can get the information out to you.

Meantime, we have ordered 4 new village signs incorporating the 'Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty' designation to be erected at strategic entry points into the village of Lyminge, to match the others across the Parish. Whilst consulting on those, Kent Highways offered to appraise the current provision of dropped kerbs across the Parish. A number of new locations have been agreed and marked out with spray paint, ready for the works to be carried out.

The appraisal with Kent Highways and FHDC on the lining outside the village shop and post office has been held in abeyance during these recent months, but we are now pursuing this again...

This month FHDC will be meeting to consider adoption of the Planning and Places Local Plan Review which will almost certainly have implications for our Parish. More details next month.

Due to the continued efforts of our Speedwatch team, Kent Police came out earlier this month to monitor speed in Rhodes Minnis and Etchinghill. A number of tickets were issued to speeding drivers in Etchinghill, and we hope that they are out again in the not too distant future, to deter drivers from speeding through the Parish.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Following guidance on Covid-19 from the Government and from the National Association of Local Councils, we regretfully had to cancel this year's Annual Parish Meeting in May. Once all community reports have been received, we will publish them on our website, but for now, we are pleased to give a few highlights from the reports received below.

Etchinghill Residents Association: We have worked very hard over the past year to secure a mains power source to facilitate the Meriden Walk Christmas tree and a permanent supply of power to facilitate the second tree near the golf club. This is a great result and means no more recharging and lugging heavy truck batteries by the committee, friends and neighbours! We also have our new website up and running www.etchinghill.info which lists all of the community activities on offer and showcases the venue as a beautiful wedding location.

Etchinghill Village Hall: We entered this last financial year in a very positive frame of mind. Bookings were holding their own due largely to a solid array of regular users. However, due to the Government's guidance relating to Covid-19 the hall has been closed since March which has obviously had a major impact on our income. The trustees continue to meet virtually and once we are able to re-open we will publish a new date for the AGM. The re-submission of the extension application has been approved by F&HDC and we are continuing with the design and costings to enable us to apply for grants for the building work in due course. The extension should hopefully provide a new storage area so that we can open up the stage, allowing it to be used for live entertainment and increase its viability as a wedding venue.

Hythe & Lyminge Age UK: We had made many plans for the year ahead as we approached 2020 to sustain the future for older people living in and around Lyminge for many years to come. Like many, our plans and services were suddenly interrupted by the Coronavirus situation. We adapted quickly, setting up the Community Hub in 48 hours, but it meant we had no choice but to close the Lyminge facility. We are now looking at ways in which we can interact with people at home in a more active way, maintaining social distance, through activity workbooks, discussions groups, online sessions and much more. The plans and developments for Age UK Hythe and Lyminge are still in the pipeline and works in Hythe are underway to ensure that we are ready for the next stage in our operations.

Lyminge Friends: 2019 was another successful year with 11 Talks and 1 Workshop on Quilting, 6 Lunches, 6 Outings including 2 Cream Teas, the Curry Night and the Christmas Party! Our most successful outings were the Elham Valley Vineyard, Samphire Hoe and Dover Castle. Our trip to Kearsney Abbey has been rescheduled for October this year (Covid19 permitting of course!).

Lyminge Historical Society: We have a membership of 68 this year. As a result of the lockdown, only the March meeting took place, but we will re-evaluate the situation in September. Meetings are held at the Tayne Centre on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7.30pm. Visitors are welcome and can pay for each talk at the door. This year we have donated two tranches of £500 each for the Pathways to the Past project – Exploring the Legacy of Ethelburga and several members took part in the archaeological project at the Parish Church.

1st Lyminge Scouts: The group grows from strength to strength. We now have 75 members, both boys and girls across the four packs- Beavers, Cubs, Scouts and Explorers' 15 leaders and a small executive of four, along with regular parent helpers keep the group running. Before lockdown we enjoyed many activities such as the Cubs district 5-a-side football — winning the cup without losing a single game; the district Beavers sleepover; Explorer's winter survival and Scout's water activity camp. The big project this last year was the installation of insulation into the hut roof and replacement of the worn felt at the same time. Thanks go to the many bodies that grant funded the £20K+ cost.

Rhodes Minnis Village Hall: All regular activities have been well attended: yoga, beetle drive, table tennis, flower shows, toddlers group etc. We arranged for the installation of the defibrillator which is a tremendous plus for the community and was strongly supported all through the process by the Committee along with LPC, Elham PC, Susan Carey and Jenny Hollingsbee. We are very pleased to be in receipt of a grant from FHDC to help support us through the difficult time and circumstances that the lockdown has presented.

And finally, the Chairman's report –

Who would have thought as we were in a crowded Tayne Centre for last year's meeting, with so many representatives from the numerous groups in our active Parish that this year would be so different? In so many ways, Covid19 has highlighted how resourceful and caring our community is in times of need. A significant number of Councillors are key workers or volunteers, working from home, and home-schooling children and have still committed time and energy to Council matters. We have had a few changes in personnel over the

Meanwhile Councillor Owen Standen called the Climate Emergency Meeting last August which attracted wide interest across the Parish and from which has developed active groups and joint projects between groups (Thoughtful Food and the Gardening Society for instance). When the new format for the Newsletter was introduced, we were more than happy to increase our presence at the centre of the Newsletter and to hand over half the space to the Climate Action initiative. Last autumn and into the spring we planted more trees and hedging "whips" on Council land to improve biodiversity and we shall be consulting shortly on work to the pond at Court Lodge Green. As a Council we are happy to promote and financially support additional recycling using the company Terracycle. (www.terracycle.com/en-GB). With bins being placed at strategic points around the Parish (details to be finalised as soon as social-distancing measures permit).

Project Manager, Rob Baldwin, has been managing the very considerable Pathways to the Past project and after the excitement of the dig last year it is great to see the path to the church laid, including the area around the War Memorial. The Council was happy to support with a grant to supply a number of information boards which will share the wealth of history our Parish holds across a wider audience.

The Councillors looking at the Built environment will have a busy time not least because Folkestone & Hythe District Council are due to adopt the Planning and Places Policy Review in July which will almost certainly have implications for our Parish.

We renewed some of the outdoor gym equipment this year and continued to support the Youth Club by meeting their running costs. Thanks are due to our Community Warden, Gary Harrison, for his commitment to this project and for everything he does across the Parish. We were pleased to support the Scouts with a grant toward the cost of works to the Scout Hut and their report shows just how well supported this group is by our young people.

Etchinghill now has mains power for its Christmas trees (no more back-breaking carrying of batteries for weary volunteers). We gave a contribution towards this and towards the defibrillator installed at Rhodes Minnis Village Hall. We also assisted with the costs of replacement CCTV equipment at Etchinghill Village Hall, Lyminge Village Hall's new kitchen, the Lyminge Association's supply of Christmas trees.

The Parish Precept was increased this year to bring the sum up to a figure in line with the Consumer Prices Index (no increase having been made for some years). This means we are well placed to continue to support Parish groups and develop ideas to enhance living in this lovely place (and cope with the unexpected, such as the bridge collapsing in Well Field).

I cannot end this report without thanking Cherri, our hard-working Clerk, who has brought us all up to date with the legislation which permits Council meetings to take place by Zoom (often featuring Councillors' cats and dogs making guest appearances). It doesn't seem to make Council meetings any shorter though! She has worked solidly through the past year and coped during the lockdown despite nursing a poorly (now recovered) husband, as well as home-schooling the children.

At the Parish meeting we would have taken questions so I invite you to email Cherri (address below) and she will pass them onto me. We always like to hear by email or phone with any of your concerns and there is always the 15 minutes set aside at our meetings (face to face or virtual) for you to speak about anything you wish to raise with us.
