Villagers will be pleased to hear that The Lyminge Association will be supporting the usual festive trees and lights along the main street this year. The committee will be installing the trees and switching on the lights on Saturday 21st November. We've also heard that **Father Christmas has sent a special message** to the young people of our community to say that he too has been affected by the corona-virus and has been asked to deliberately keep his visits to a minimum. So he will not be coming to switch on the lights and deliver any presents in the time leading up to Christmas, but he'll make every effort to deliver the children's presents on Christmas Eve.

So as we move through autumn to winter, and the pandemic continues to run amok, we must not forget our neighbours and friends. In the spring it was a fear and sense of "We are all in it together". However, things are different now and fear has been replaced with fatigue. The pandemic has exhausted us all, regardless of where we live or what we do. During the first lock-down, many people were focused on tackling this pandemic as a united community. This time people are worrying more about themselves, their survival along with their own needs. Whilst partially understandable, we must not let this attitude get in the way of supporting our friends and neighbours, not just for the week or the month but for the long haul until the virus is overcome or we develop a strategy to cope with it.

In Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth's Birthday Honours List, Cleo Smith, CO of Age UK Hythe & Lyminge, was awarded the British Empire Medal for services to the community during Covid-19.

When lockdown was announced Cleo established the Community Support Hub based in the Hythe Centre to support vulnerable people across the area. Within days, Cleo and her team took 4000 calls, made 1600 calls to vulnerable people, delivered 1200 hot meals, organised shopping and prescription collections, befriending of lonely people and a whole range of other things to make sure people weren't forgotten. The team has since gone from strength to strength, at the last count, helping over 18000 people.

Cleo said: "I am absolutely honoured to receive this award. I am extremely proud of the staff and volunteer team, they have all pulled together without question to ensure that those living in our local community were supported and continue to be.

I love my job, and although recent times have been extremely challenging, I have great satisfaction in knowing, that we as an organisation have helped and supported over 18,000 individual people in so many ways.



District Councillors' Update - November 2020

Congratulations to Cleo Smith of Age UK Hythe and Lyminge who has been awarded a BEM in the Queen's Birthday Honours list for her work during the recent pandemic. It's good to see one of the local 'heroes' honoured in this way. (See P4)

Congratulations as well to Etchinghill resident Judith Lansdell who reached her 100th birthday on 25 September and celebrated with friends and family at The Gatekeeper. Judith received an MBE in 1999 for services to the Shepway Victim Support Scheme.

On 1 October, your District Council took back direct control of its housing



We attended a briefing on the council's 'my account' service which offers all residents a personalised service on the website. It's still in its early stages but new facilities will be added to what's already on offer which includes details of waste and recycling services and planning applications.

Our meetings at the council continue to be online and are likely to continue that way for the foreseeable future. Many more residents now also look to contact the council online rather than come to a building. We are also keen to reduce the amount of money the council pays to run our buildings and reduce our carbon footprint. We have therefore asked our officers to look at options for disposing of the Civic Centre building in Folkestone. We are likely to keep a much smaller public office in Folkestone (possibly in the old Debenhams building now renamed 'Folca') with back office staff based at Otterpool Park. There's a lot of work to do before a decision can be taken and we will keep you informed of progress.

Folca? It was the winning entry from over 200 suggestions to rename the old Debenham's building which was bought by the District Council in May. 'Folca's stone' is said to have marked a meeting place for local people and is thought to be the origin of the name Folkestone. Options for the building are still being developed. Suggestions have included a medical centre, workspaces and shop units. There is plenty of space for all these uses and more.

A reminder that the NHS Track and Trace app is available to download here https://www.nhs.uk/apps-library/nhs-covid-19/ There is no charge for this. Our district has a lower rate of Covid cases than most of the country and measures such as Track and Trace can help keep it that way.

Pathways to the Past

Exploring the Legacy of Ethelburga

It is just over a year since we uncovered the remains of Queen Ethelburga's church in the churchyard. We are delighted to unveil our artist's reconstruction of what we think the interior of this church looked like

around 650 AD, shortly after Ethelburga died.

If you go to our website at https://geopaethas.com/2020/10/07/re-creating-queen-ethelburgas-church , you can also see a picture of the church and monastery. Printed copies are for sale through the website.

Visitors to the churchyard should now see a great improvement after a working party in October cleared away the last remnants of the spoil heaps from the dig last year. We have planted several thousand bulbs and sown wild flowers and grass seed in accordance with our new management plan to improve bio-diversity. Many thanks to the stalwart group of volunteers who turned out on a really wet weekend to make this happen.

We are still looking for funding to help us complete the last few elements of our project, which will include further work to enhance the church yard through new planting and management of the trees. PROPOSED PENTLAND HOMES DEVELOPMENT

With the adoption by FHDC of the Places and Polices Local Plan last month, the way was clear for Pentland Homes to lodge a planning application on the land presently forming part of the golf course. Pentland have duly submitted application under reference 20/1397/FH and the application can be viewed on the District Council's website. Some of you may have attended the presentation almost 2 years ago at the Golf Club when the proposals were put forward for initial public comment. The land has now been included the Local Plan in development, but your views remain valid please email the planning department as soon as possible with any comments or concerns you may have, once you have read the planning statement in the application file.

One important aspect is the Public Right of Way linking Etchinghill and Lyminge and the enhancement of the path to provide safe access for people of all abilities. The Parish Council will lodge its comments by reference to the effect on the BUILT environment of the village (the design itself and traffic management with particular reference to the policies applicable to the the NATURAL environment ANOB). (examining the steps taken to date and intended to be taken to preserve and enhance the natural environment, the level of carbon generated by the development etc), the HISTORICAL environment -

looking at the impact on the archaeology of the site and the SOCIAL implications of the development (which is intended to include some affordable housing (by examining what this actually means in this context), the impact on health services in the village and the education facilities etc.

Thoughtful Food Visit to Windmill Community Forest Gardening

At the end of September, members of Thoughtful Food visited Windmill Community Forest Garden in Margate. Started 5 years ago, the forest garden is part of their scheme to produce food that can be shared with the community. It was an interesting outing, and very inspiring to see the diverse range of produce that a forest garden can provide, as well as a beautiful space in which to enjoy a stroll.

The Windmill Community Forest Garden includes a huge array of plants, most of which contain edible parts, that are





designed to work together and mimic a natural ecosystem. The garden includes apple, pear, olive, lime and quince trees, hawthorn, elder, blackthorn and sea buckthorn grown as shrubs, as well as many smaller plants, such as rosemary and redcurrant. Now established, the produce can be foraged, and the garden is also a fantastic habitat for local wildlife.

Community Allotment

We are coming to the end of the main growing season in our first year of running the Community Allotment. For the most part, the allotment is being 'put to bed' by mulching with a sheet of cardboard and a layer of well-rotted manure, following 'nodig' gardening methods that help to restore the soil. Thank you for recent donations for the plot, including elephant garlic, that will be planted in the coming week, and lots of well-rotted manure. There have been many contributions to the Community Allotment this year, from time and muscle (!) to seeds, plants and expertise. Thank you to everyone who has been involved; despite the additional challenges faced this year, the plot has been very successful. Please do get in touch if you would like to be involved - no experience is necessary and it can be a great way to learn before getting started with growing food in your own garden.



Become a Cut Above the Rest

Autumn is a critical season for wildlife. Birds, small mammals and amphibians rely on the rural larder of fruits, nuts and insects to increase their body fat prior to the ensuing cold hunger gap.

It is widely known that the State of Nature in the UK is poor, with the UK being rated globally as being in the bottom 10% of nature depleted countries.

As a rural parish it is important that we all make every effort to stop the local decline of wildlife. Hedgerow cutting in autumn removes an entire food supply, extending the hunger gap from October through until March. Bare hedgerows eliminate small insects, spiders and larva, with additional removal of autumn foliage that offers protection and shelter through early winter. This management technique is a direct cause of bird decline in the countryside.

The alternative is hedge cutting from December to February. Hedges cut during this time retain protection, shelter and an essential food supply deep into the winter season.

Without putting obstacles in the way of management, land managers, farmers, gardeners and Parish Councillors need to identify opportunities. Some fields are not accessible through the heavy wet clay conditions of winter, some roadside corners may require trimming for road safety. But, this leaves many miles of hedgerows around fields and gardens that are cut bare through the autumn without any justification and a subsequent brutal impact on our wildlife.

Wildlife needs habitat to be enriched and restored before the loss of species tips beyond recoverable populations. The tree sparrow is now locally extinct due to habitat loss.

We can identify opportunities in our own gardens, land and farms to allow hedgerows to grow. Many species such as hawthorn do not fruit until their second year of growth. Endangered species such as Turtle Dove, has suffered a 93% decline since the 1970's. This beautiful summer visitor relies on mature hedgerows with a species rich grassland close by to provide insects for their chicks. Just one Turtle Dove was recorded in Monks Horton in 2020.

A hedge with benefits: Hedgerows provide shelter for livestock, break up the ferocity of wind across crops and aid in the reduction of flooding and soil run-off through soil stabilisation and deep rooting. Autumn foliage and fruiting also delivers a vivid palette in the garden and field boundary. There is not much not to like about a healthy, well connected,



Winter is a time for planting too. We can look for opportunities to fill in hedgerow gaps to extend hunting strips for bats. Correct species selection is imperative. Native hedgerows bursting with thorn, hazel, dogwood and field maple provide a glut of food and shelter whilst the popular laurel bears no positive attributes other than shelter for mice from a scouring kestrel. This species even alters soil microbiology and inhibits all other plant growth. Certainly, one to steer away from.

With a topographic landscape of rolling hills, copses, farmland and pretty houses it is time to look more closely at how to connect this landscape, attribute management to improve the environment and restore wildlife before it is too late.

Wayside Watch

This time of the year sees the fruits of many wild plants which are very much needed by our wildlife.

The black berries are on the **Elder**Tree [Sambucus nigra]. As well as being eaten by wildlife these are often picked and turned into elderberry wine or elderberry jelly.

To the right is the fruit of the **Hawthorn** or **May Tree**. [Crataegus monogyna] Those pinkish white blossoms in May have now turned into a blaze of red berries or 'haws'. Sometimes referred to as the Bread & Butter/ Cheese Tree, with the leaves being the bread and the paste coming from the berries being the butter or cheese.

The purple Mystery Flower from last month was identified as being a **Common Spotted Orchid** [Dactylorhiza fuchsii] or an **Early Purple Orchid** [Orchis mascula]. Thank you to Alan Shallcross and Chris & Sarah Glass for their suggestions

The second, shown again to the right, still seems to be a mystery since no one has come up with an answer - yet.
