Letter for October 2020

As a child I loved solitude and when I reached the age of eleven, we moved to a large tumble down house where the door knobs were wooden cotton reels and the light switches were just bare wires you put together at your peril; sparks flying until the light finally came. My Father worked in the city of London travelling on the train everyday. He was up early, home late but always made time to slowly do the house up in his spare time. It became a beautiful house and home where I finally got my own bedroom, which was bliss.

I loved to read, pray and dream. I imagined one day I would be a lighthouse keeper way out into the sea, on my own, in the elements and help be a beacon of light to the ships that went by, hoping that would keep them safe from harm and guide them to safety, being a 'Beacon of Hope'.

This Autumn season Bishop Rose is calling us to ask ourselves these questions:

- 1. What are we noticing?
- 2. What are we learning?
- 3. What are we letting go of or allowing to die?

(She would like feedback so if you would like to share your thoughts and send them to me I can gather them and send them to her.)

Bishop Rose is asking us to listen and discern on the way about God's call on all our lives to be a 'Beacon of Hope.'

Jeremiah prophesied at a time like this, in a time of national disaster. But he brought to the exiles in Babylon a message of hope:

'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.' (Jeremiah 29:11)

Jeremiah was called by God to invest in hope, not to retreat, not to give up but to believe in a time of rebuilding and believe he was very much a part of God's plan.

Battle of Britain Pilot - Squadron Leader Michael Crossley

On Saturday 24 August 1940 at 16.30hrs Sqn Ldr Michael Crossley is unhurt after he crash lands Hurricane P3481 skidding across a field near Valley Farm, Skeete, Lyminge. The aircraft is classed as Cat 3, destroyed. At the time he is the RAF's leading ace, having been credited with 18 or 20 victories, depending on the source. He was awarded the DSO on 30 August 1940. The London Gazette records the following:

"Acting Squadron Leader Michael Nicholson Crossley, D.F.C. (37554)

This officer has lead his section, flight and squadron with skill and courage and has flown almost continuously since the commencement of hostilities. Since May, he has participated in engagements against the enemy over Holland, Belgium and France, including patrols over Dunkirk and St. Valery during the evacuation operations. In August he destroyed two Junkers 88 over Portsmouth and assisted in the destruction of another over Croydon. During the latter engagement he encountered another Junkers 88 and, having expended all this ammunition, acted as above guard until two of his section finally destroyed it. The next day he destroyed three enemy aircraft. Squadron Leader Crossley has now destroyed a total of eighteen enemy aircraft and possibly another five. He has displayed rare qualities as a leader; his example of courage and tenacity of purpose have proved an inspiration to other members of his squadron."

District Councillors' Update - October 2020

We're delighted this month to have good news to share. Folkestone & Hythe District Council has retained its award for Customer Service Excellence which it's held since 2013. This accreditation is externally audited by iESE and covers 57 standards. The council was found to be compliant across all these and achieved a score of Compliance Plus for 15 areas which is the highest score and means service goes 'above and beyond' what's expected. Compliance plus is awarded when the practice is innovative and something that could be shared and replicated in other organisations. The assessor also commented on how well the council has risen to the challenges of COVID-19. We're proud of our staff and know they are keen to do even better in future.



We are also pleased to report that a new 8-year contract from January 2021 has been agreed with Veolia to continue the kerbside waste and recycling collections. Our District was one of the few that kept the full range of waste and recycling collections operating without interruption during lockdown including accepting new enrolments for the garden waste service. The new contract will include a new 'green' fleet of vehicles and a number of initiatives to help us achieve the council's ambition of Net Zero for its services by 2030. Services to your property will continue to be alternating fortnightly waste and recycling collections and a weekly food waste collection.

Last month we reported that the full council (all 30 councillors) at Folkestone & Hythe District Council would be debating the Places and Policies Local Plan on 16 September. After years of work and an examination in public by an independent Planning Inspector who found the plan to be 'sound' we can report that a clear majority of councillors voted to adopt the plan. This means the council is in a strong position to resist any speculative housing developments whilst meeting our legal obligation to provide sufficient land for future homes and jobs.

One of our regular Speedwatch sessions in the parish on 14 September was joined by Matthew Scott, Kent's Police & Crime Commissioner. Matthew is a supporter of Speedwatch and includes it in the matters the Chief Constable reports to him about. It was useful for Matthew to see the team in action and hear about the work he is doing to increase Kent Police action against traffic offences. Well done Colin Manvell and his Speedwatch volunteers.

Pathways to the Past

Exploring the Legacy of Ethelburga

Now that the new paths have been laid, we have been developing a planting scheme that we hope will further improve the look of the churchyard while enhancing biodiversity. A ground management plan will help us keep this going and increase the areas of wildflowers going forward into the future. The graveyard remains in use and graves are tended in many places, so it is not just about turning it into a wildlife reserve. We need to strike a careful balance

The church yard is a place that the whole village can enjoy as a green open space. It is a vital part of the green corridor being created from the fields to the south west across Court Lodge Green (the Bumpy Field) to Well Field and Tayne Field right in the centre of the village. This is already an amazingly large and biologically diverse stretch of ground. We are very lucky it has not been built upon, and it is an immensely valuable asset for our community. We are keen for the church yard to play a full part in this environmental scheme that is being developed in partnership with the Parish Council.

If you think this is a worthwhile plan, there is an opportunity now to give us practical help to turn it into reality. We are looking for volunteers to help us clear some of the rubble left over from last summer's dig, plant bulbs and sow wildflower seed. We have a limited planting window if we are to allow germination before the winter sets in, so the working party will meet at the church yard on Saturday 3 October at 9am, and again on Sunday 4 October at 10am.

If you would like to help, please email us at geopaethas@gmail.com, and we will send you instructions for the day. You will need to bring tools and wear suitable clothing. There is plenty of work to do, so please come along if you can spare the time. The more people who help, the better the churchyard will look next year.

The scope and scale of the planting in the churchyard will be determined by how much we have to spend. If you would like to donate to this initiative, then please go to our PayPal giving page at paypal.com/fundraiser/charity/3200879. You can make a gift by card or through PayPal, and if you are a taxpayer, you can add 25% to your donation through Gift Aid. PayPal does not charge us for this, so all your donation will go towards the project.

The project has now been in progress for over 2 years. We hope you will agree we have achieved a lot, but there is still more we can do before we wind it up. We are grateful for any help you can give.

The Black and White Minstrel Show

BBC producer, George Inns, working in collaboration with George Mitchell and his singers introduced the Black & White Minstrel show to BBC television on 14th June 1958. Male singers appeared in blackface; the female dancers, originally The Television Toppers, appeared as themselves. The lead singers were baritone Dia Francis, tenor John Boulter and bass Tony Mercer; they could not have been more suited to their roles.

The show was extravagant by BBC standards at the time, pacey and slick, with songs from a wide repertory of American minstrel, country and popular music hall numbers. The show ran from June 1958 until July 1978 at prime-time viewing on Saturday night with an average audience of 18 million viewers, peaking at 21 million, figures TV executives and producers can only dream about today. In 1961 the show won the Golden Rose of Montreux for the best light entertainment programme. It was sold to over 30 countries, with Australia and New Zealand covering it with their own versions. A stage performance appeared at the Victoria Palace Theatre, which ran from 1962 to 1972 and appears in the Guinness Book of Records as a stage show seen by the largest number of people.

All this runaway success and enjoyment to millions is however tainted with some serious undercurrents. The Campaign Against Racial Discrimination declared the show to be offensive to the black community, perpetuating racist and ethnic stereotypes. Clearly, the BBC executives and producers had paid little attention to the sensitivities of black people, they appear to have been blinded by their own success. Today, watching a replay of the shows, it is easy to understand the outrage ethnic communities felt at the time. If the show had been made specifically for radio, these insulting caricatures of black people would obviously not exist.

Forthcoming Council and Committee Agendas are displayed on the Council notice boards in Station Road car park, the Rhodes Minnis bus shelter and the entrance to the Village Hall car park Etchinghill. Agendas and minutes are published on the Council's website www.lymingepc.kentparishes.gov.uk and Facebook page. We invite you to read the minutes online or on the noticeboards which may provide the information you are seeking regarding a particular item, but correspondence is always welcome from parishioners and can be sent to the Clerk at the addresses given below.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

Councillors have been looking at all aspects of village life and how we might as councillors work most effectively together, not just in dealing with the day to day necessities that tend to dominate our monthly meetings, but by building a framework or plan for the future. At a recent meeting we adopted an ambitious plan which will be published in full shortly, but meantime here is a brief synopsis: we identified four key areas:

- 1. Our SOCIAL environment a parish is all about its people and the communities they form: from 2 to 92 there's likely to be an activity or group to cater for your interests or concerns. The representatives of the many organisations represented at the 2019 Parish Meeting confirmed that we have a thriving, caring community. We plan to develop closer links with existing groups and organisations e.g. Age UK, particularly in the light of the effect COVID19 has on the ability for people to meet and socialise.
- 2. Our NATURAL environment we are fortunate indeed to live in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, but we also live in a time of Climate Emergency: therefore all our decision-making, in terms of the land which we own, and schemes we decide to promote, will seek to protect and enhance biodiversity. Our first action is to support Lyminge Climate Action, making space available to them in the

Newsletter in order to spread the word about those things we can do to help our fragile planet.

- 3. Our HISTORIC environment we have a rich seam of history of running through our Parish. We plan to support the sharing of the knowledge of that history and encourage others to come and learn about it, whether it's our Anglo Saxon history, our ancient paths and woodlands, the Elham Valley Railway and more besides.
- 4. Our BUILT environment we recognise the AONB status of the Parish needs to be considered carefully with the pressure placed upon the countryside to provide more and more homes in small villages and hamlets. We have agreed to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan (more details below) to set out the views of the Parish. The built environment includes roads and traffic management and we are working with Kent Highways to prepare Highway Improvement Plans for the parish to try to achieve lower vehicle speeds in our villages and improve facilities for safer cycling.

Two essential elements flow through the plan: good governance (i.e. everything we undertake is strictly in accordance with the powers we have as a Parish Council) and communication with our parishioners — hence this initial outline of the plan. The full document will be published in full shortly.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE – OPPORTUNITY OR THREAT?

The government is proposing to introduce radical new planning laws and we are invited to take part in the public consultation – see -

https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/planning-for-the-future

The proposed changes will have a profound effect on the allocation of housing land and other land for development, will reduce the time that Local Councils have to prepare their Local Plans but at the same time, promises to involve local communities in the preparation phase of formulating the plans.

Do take time to read the document and, if you can, take part in the Consultation – you will find that a series of questions are included that are presumably designed to help the Government to shape the way in which the new planning laws will be drafted.

In the meantime, the parish council intends to give FHDC notice that we intend to create our own Neighbourhood Plan. These plans will become part of the supplementary planning guidance. This will be our opportunity to take an active part in shaping the way our Parish will develop in the future and we should grasp the opportunity with enthusiasm. We should be given the resources to help us in the process, so if you have views on anything that you would like to see

included, please come forward and join the working party that we intend to set up.



Forest Gardening - Part 2

In September's Newsletter, we introduced the concept of Forest Gardening, which can be a great way to manage our garden spaces to produce food in a sustainable way that is wildlife-friendly. This month, we have set out the key features of a forest garden to give a clearer idea of how a forest garden works in practice.

Key Features of a Forest Garden

- 1. A forest garden mimics a forest ecosystem, where vegetation can be divided into 7 horizontal layers, to maximise the space and growing time
- 2. Broad diversity of plants allows a number of different crops to be grown and supports a greater range of wildlife
- 3. Plants are chosen to compliment and support each other, rather than compete
- 4. Some plants are chosen not for their food value, but for their ability to improve the soil for other plants, or to deter pests, helping to make other fertilisers or pesticides unnecessary
- 5. The use of natural cycles to help make the garden self-sustaining, such as leaf litter to provide nutrients to the soil
- 6. A forest garden can be adapted to suit the space available, the conditions of the garden (soil type, sun exposure, existing vegetation etc) and needs of the gardener

Lyminge Environmental Group working with Lyminge Parish Church

We have been working with the church to help create something a bit special in the church yard. The plans have been agreed and we are hoping to get some work started this year! Can you spare some time to get things going? Please share with networks

The churchyard is a place that the whole village can enjoy as a green open space. It is a vital part of the green corridor being created from the fields to the south west across Court Lodge Green (the Bumpy Field) to Well Field and Tayne Field right in the centre of the village. This is already an amazingly large and biologically diverse stretch of ground. We are very lucky it has not been built upon, and it is an immensely valuable asset for our community. We are keen for the churchyard to play a full part in this environmental scheme that is being developed in partnership with the Parish Council.

We think this is a worthwhile plan and so there is an opportunity for you to give us practical help to turn it into reality. We are looking for volunteers to help us clear some of the rubble left over from last summer's dig, plant bulbs and sow wild flower seed. We have a limited planting window if we are to allow germination before the winter sets in, so the working party will meet at the churchyard on Saturday 3 October at 9am, and again on Sunday 4 October at 10am. Please wear appropriate protective clothing and bring the tools you think will be useful.

Animal Populations Plummeting


With a million species at risk of extinction, Sir David Attenborough explores how this crisis of biodiversity has consequences for us all, threatening food and water security, undermining our ability to control our climate and even putting us at greater risk of pandemic diseases.

Extinction is now happening up to 100 times faster than the natural evolutionary rate, but the issue is about more than the loss of individual species. Everything in the natural world is connected in networks that support the whole of life on earth, including us, and we are losing many of the benefits that nature provides to us. The loss of insects is threatening the pollination of crops, while the loss of biodiversity in the soil also threatens plants growth. Plants underpin many of the things that we need, and yet one in four is now threatened with extinction.

Last year, a UN report identified the key drivers of biodiversity loss, including overfishing, climate change and pollution. But the single biggest driver of biodiversity loss is the destruction of natural habitats. Seventy-five per cent of Earth's land surface (where not covered by ice) has been changed by humans, much of it for agriculture, and as consumers we may unwittingly be contributing towards the loss of species through what we buy in the supermarket. www.bbc.co.uk/

Animal Populations Plummeting.

You probably knew this but we're rapidly losing wildlife populations, which in turn means we're losing the security of the ecosystems they provide. The latest report on this crash estimates animal communities have shrunk by an average of 68% since 1970. In the tropical Americas and in habitats near freshwater it's much worse - drops of 94% and 84% respectively. Deforestation, overfishing, invasive species, climate change and pollution are driving this change, according to the authors of the report, published by WWF and the Zoological Society of London.



Findings of a new report shows how the possibility of having a billion humans displaced.

An estimated 1.2 billion people could be displaced by 2050, as the climate crisis and a growing population drive increasing migration, according to a new analysis by the Institute for Economics and Peace. The think-tank produces annual global terrorism and peace indexes and has now turned its hand to its first ecological threat register. Its analysis found that 31 countries are not sufficiently resilient to withstand ecological threats, such as natural disasters, water and food shortages. "Ecological threats pose serious challenges to global peace," the institute's founder said.

The Lyminge Association (13 committee members who meet monthly) aims to

This year our mission has been markedly affected by the arrival of the coronavirus (COVID-19). It has curtailed many planned events which were suspended or cancelled from March 2020 onwards. This sadly included our 50-year celebration of the inauguration of The Lyminge Association planned for 4

There were two major highlights this year:

- 1. The first highlight was the revamping of The Lyminge Association Newsletter. - 6. Christmas Trees placed along the main road in Lyminge seemed to spark a resonance among the inhabitants who raised the bar of their own lights. Again, the LA is grateful to LPC for funding towards the large tree outside Laing Bennett.
- 7. Christmas Lights Switch-On with safety of paramount concern, the Switch-On was located in the playground of Lyminge Primary School. The customary main tree and lights outside Laing Bennett remained in place. Overall the feedback was mixed.
- 8. Christmas Parcel Delivery 35 homes visited, and 65 presents delivered!!
- 9. Concert Event 7th March 'Memory Lane' were invited to return for the Spring Concert and
- 10. Planters throughout the villages continue to be maintained by volunteers and overseen by LA


