ETCHINGHILL RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION Film Night

The results of our questionnaire have been very revealing and I appreciate the time everyone has taken to reply so far. If you haven't replied as yet, please do so as your opinions and comments are important.

In essence, it appears that we made the correct decision to suspend our Film Nights, at least for the foreseeable future. The results are still coming in but so far, from 34 replies, they are:

The Surgery - Church Road - Lyminge

If you are a patient at The Surgery, Church Road, Lyminge and have online access, then have you considered using **eConsult** and **Patient Access**?

eConsult System

eConsult is a clever piece of software that allows you to quickly and safely get help and advice from your own doctors and GP practice online, for free, from anywhere. **eConsult** is a form-based online consultation platform that collects your medical or administrative request and sends it through to your GP practice to triage and decide on the right care for you and everyone else. **eConsult** can be used for a variety of health problems and for requesting fit-to-work notes and other admin requirements. Once completed the **eConsult** information comes through to The Surgery and is reviewed by the GP with advice or treatment given by 6.30pm of the next working day.

To access this site visit the Surgery website, **www.thesurgerylyminge.nhs.uk** and click on the 'Get Started' box under **eConsult**. Follow the various options and provide the information dependent on your personal need.

This is NOT to be used for URGENT treatment or care.

Patient Access

We are asking patients to register with **Patient Access**. This can be used to order medication through an app or online. There is no need to complete repeat prescription slips to request medication. It can be done automatically and sent via the internet into the clinical system.

To access this support, you need to complete a registration form that can be found on our website. Once it has been completed and submitted along with a copy of some form of ID, you will be registered. Subsequently, your log-on details will be sent to you by email and you are then ready to go.

There is considerable positive feedback from the patients that have used this service. It provides the GPs with useful information and improves the efficiency of the The Surgery.

Lyminge Village Hall Update

The LVH management committee wish to thank Susan Carey and Jenny Hollingsbee, our Folkestone and Hythe District Councillors, who have supported the Village Hall in obtaining several grants in the last couple of months. One of which has thankfully buffered us against the financial losses of having to close the Hall during the Covid-19 lockdown and the other will enable us to purchase a much larger fridge for our recently renovated kitchen. This will make running catering larger social events like the Christmas Day Lunch Club, quiz nights and weddings so much easier. Fingers crossed they may be able to be held again in the not too distant future!

Looking ahead to this autumn we are disappointed to confirm that the Village Hall will not be putting on our annual fireworks display this year as the social distancing limitations and infection risks are deemed too great to overcome.

However, we are focussing on what we can do: installing our new permanent hand sanitising station at the front entrance, communicating with all our regular user groups and risk assessing how we can begin to safely open up the Hall to more than one group. Currently, the Hall is only being used by Lyminge Preschool, providing a vital service for local families who are trying to get back to work. Being sole users has enabled them to operate safely without risk of cross contamination from other groups.

At the present time, we are not allowing other private hire events to take place in the Hall but we are constantly reviewing the situation and doing our best to reschedule existing bookings for future dates. 


Extract from: The Folkestone, Hythe, Sandgate & Cheriton Herald - Saturday 13 August 1921 (picture from 20 August 1921)

GIRL GUIDES AT LYMINGE .CAMP FIRE TEA UNIQUE "BOUQUET" FOR THE MAYORESS The Folkestone Divisional and District Commissioner, Guiders, and Guides held what was termed a camp fire at the newly acquired meadow, Cloverland, Lyminge, on Thursday afternoon last. Here amidst beautiful surroundings. Nos 3 and 3a Companies of Girl Guides were tented out, the camp being well-laid out on semi-military lines, in the centre fluttered the Union Jack, at the base of the flag-staff being a clump of clover the emblem of the guides, 'two big wood fires were blazing and over there the old-fashioned type camp kettles were boiling. Amongst those who were welcomed on the ground by the Divisional Commissioner (Mrs. Percy Lewis), the District Commissioner (Miss Lewis) and other officers were the Mayor (Alderman Reginald G. Wood, J.P.), and the Mayoress, the Rev. E. S.W. Watson (Rector Lyminge)

Extract from: Folkestone Express, Sandgate, Shorncliffe & Hythe Advertiser - Saturday 05 September 1903.... ...reported it took an hour to get to a fire in Lyminge

A FIRE AT LYMINGE. FOLKESTONE FIREMAN INJURED. On Saturday afternoon Captain Nichols, of the Folkestone Fire Brigade, received intimation of a fire at Lyminge. The men at once turned out, and reached the scene of the outbreak within an hour. It appears that two hay stacks at Valley Farm, which is in the occupation of Mr. Fisher, who also carries on business as a corn factor in Foord Road, Folkestone, caught fire, but, despite the efforts of the brigade, only a portion of one of them was saved. During the operations Fireman Wood unfortunately had one of his feet very badly burned, and had to be conveyed home. He is progressing favourably, but it is doubtful whether he will be able to resume his duties for a considerable time. The brigade returned to Folkestone just before ten o'clock.



District Councillors' Update - August 2020

More and more services have been moving online and the pandemic has underlined the benefit of being able to be in contact without needing to be face to face. In line with this trend, your District Council has introduced 'my account' on its website so that residents can see information directly relevant to them and not have to search through the whole website. 'My account' shows which bin collections are made and when to your property, who your elected representatives are and information on your council tax bill. 'My account' is designed to be 'mobile friendly' and more services will be added to it. You need an email address to sign up to 'my account' and information from your council tax bill to access the full range of services. It takes just a few moments to register and should make it easier for you to find information and report problems. Do give it a try.



We've reported before about how our council meetings have moved online. We've had Cabinet, Planning and Overview & Scrutiny meetings by Zoom and now on 16 September we will be holding a Full Council meeting to consider the Places and Policies Local Plan. Without such a plan our district is open to development taking place anywhere and, whilst people sometimes complain there is too much development, there would be far more and in far worse places without these council policies. The Government currently has two consultations underway about changes to the way areas are designated as suitable for development but in the meantime, we need the Places and Policies Local Plan. If you are interested, you can view the papers for the meeting on the council website and the meeting itself is webcast live.

Another meeting that might be of interest is the Licensing Sub-Committee of 27 July which approved an application from Immigration Enforcement for the revocation of the premises licence of Spicy Touch restaurant in Lyminge. The restaurant was found to be employing someone not entitled to work and the fine imposed for this remained unpaid. The report found no evidence of modern slavery but the owner was in clear breach of the law.

The District Council continues to face many problems from the visitors who have flocked to our coast to enjoy the summer weather. Working with Kent Police we've been trying to make sure that people can enjoy our beautiful area whilst respecting the need for social distancing. We're not helped by people who use our beaches for large events without permission as happened in Greatstone on 08 August. The council will seek to prosecute the event organiser, recover the costs of the clean-up needed and prevent a re-occurrence. It was, however, heartening that over 60 volunteers were out on the beach the day after it was trashed to help clear it of rubbish.

Finally, we are sad to report the death of Robert Bliss who became leader of the District Council at what was probably its lowest point in 2004 when the previous short-lived administration had left the council finances and services in a ruinous state. Robert led the council with courage, good humour and shrewdness. Our district owes a great deal to Robert and our thoughts and prayers are with his family.

We are delighted at the positive feedback we have received about the new paths in the churchyard. This is very welcome. The project is being run entirely by volunteers, so it does help to know that our efforts are appreciated.

The wall by the south porch has now been repaired but there is, of course more work to do to clean up the churchyard. Our contractors have a few things more to do before the contract is complete. Then it will be a matter of deciding how to manage the churchyard going forward

and what to plant in order to turn it into an area supporting a range of plant and animal life. We can then let you know when we are ready to move forward, which is likely now to be in the Autumn.

We have made great progress over the past month planning the new information panels that will be installed around the village highlighting the amazing archaeology that has been found over the past decade or so. We hope these will be ready to be installed during the Autumn, but this will depend upon when the illustrations of the reconstructed Anglo-Saxon church are finished. These are being created for us by an archaeological artist.

This little story is quite true, only the name of the priest has been changed to protect his identity.

Father Joseph, a dedicated priest of many years, was addressing his congregation from the lecturn at his local church. "We are all children of God, god's loving creation, therefore we are all going to heaven, every one of us".

Now whatever views you may hold on religion, few would deny this to be a very positive message. It was generally well received by the congregation, some doubters of course, and an even smaller group who honestly believe that only Catholics go to heaven. It is this smaller group that became the motivation in a story that I'm about to relate.

This rather surprising revelation by Father Joseph was not confined to just one sermon. In the coming weekly homilies, he was to elaborate on this theme, which served only to cause a wider rift amongst his Catholic brethren. Something had to be done; a decision was taken to inform the Bishop, and the letter was sent. What exactly was expected to be achieved by this action is uncertain, but its effect was immediate. On opening his Presbytery door, Father Joseph was quite astounded to witness the Bishop in full raiment complete with mitre and crook, facing him on the doorstep.

"What's all this about Joseph? You're telling them there is no such place as purgatory, there is no such place as hell, and that they would all be going to heaven"... "Please come in my Lord Bishop, I'll make you a nice cup of tea and explain". With his tea, the Bishop was comfortably seated, and bringing his hands together as if in prayer, listened as Father Joseph began to speak. The Bishop slowly close his eyes giving the occasional slight nod as if in agreement as Father Joseph revealed his thoughts.

Finally he came to that rather obtuse line in the Apostles Creed, "Jesus was crucified, died and was buried, he descended into hell"..... WHAT!! Jesus descended into hell?... YES... he went to rescue all the poor souls that had been sent there... because Jesus came to save and forgive <u>all</u> sinners, therefore we are all going to heaven.

After a few moments of silence, the Bishop slowly opened his eyes, turned towards Father Joseph and said..... "Got any cake?". John Phillips

Lyminge Village Sign

A number of people, particularly relative newcomers to the village, have wondered about the source of the Lyminge signs that grace the main entrances to the village. A little research found this article from Ann Sparkes which is reprinted below along with a colour photograph included in on P23.

"The Lyminge Village Signs were unveiled on 24th June 1990 – the culmination of over a year of behind-the-scenes planning and work.

The entries for a design-the-sign competition were displayed at an Art and Craft show, at the Village Hall in October 1988, where residents could vote for their preferred design. The winning entry, by Ann Sparkes, shows images of the history of Lyminge – the Church tower behind the figure of St. Ethelburga, a steam locomotive depicting the Elham Valley Railway, a group of sheep and the River Nailbourne.

A full-size mould was made by Rosie Robus of Acrise Potteries, from which Oyster Signs of Whitstable cast two double-sided signs in fibre glass. Jim Smith from Lyminge Joinery made the posts and carved the name boards and 'rivers'. The signs were painted by Ann Sparkes using Humbrol enamel paints and landscape gardeners T. Metcalfe from Rhodes Minnis did the groundwork and erected the signs prior to the unveiling ceremony.

The signs were dedicated by Rev. Kent and Pastor Lolley, and unveiled by Doug Pidding and Bert Lewis at the ceremony attended by many residents and visitors. The cost of £1400 for the signs was met by the Lyminge Association and the Parish Council together with donations from villagers and generous financial support from British Gas.

Over the years the signs have suffered from weather damage, strong winds blowing down both signs on different occasions, and a car accident. They have been fully re-painted twice by Ann, repaired and re-erected by Steve Sparkes and Adrian Willcox – the latest 'wash and brush up' took place in October 2006.

Editor: Since then, The Lyminge Association commissioned a third sign as a spare. More recently, the replacement of the posts, along with a further 'wash and brush up' took place in 2018.

Letter To The Editor.....

Dear Sir

A recent letter from one of your correspondents highlighted the issue of walkers making their way across or around fields where no footpath is designated. Understandably this is irksome for the farmers, but there is the other side of the coin. Very few local landowners fulfill their responsibilities regarding public footpaths under the Countryside Act 2000. There it states that footpaths around the perimeter of a field should be a **MINIMUM** of 1.5m wide and kept clear. Footpaths through a field the footpath should be a **MINIMUM** of one metre and kept clear of crops. During the winter, one farmer ploughed up a footpath and did nothing to reinstate it.

So there are responsibilities on both sides. Let us all fulfill them.


ROAD RE-SURFACING

What we weren't expecting when we tried "No mow May"!

This year, unsurprisingly, we have been spending a lot more time than usual outside. Considering ourselves extremely fortunate, we took home schooling outside and have been looking a bit more carefully to

see what is going on in the garden.

We've been encouraging bees into our garden with lots of bee friendly plants, but have also been experimenting with letting a bit more of our garden do its own thing. Having read up a bit on all the benefits of letting the lawn grow freely in May, I managed to persuade my lawn-mowing-loving husband to have a month off.

First came the dandelions; followed by even more bees! We counted 7 different types of

bumblebees in our garden along with a number of others including honey bees and found a nest of buff-tailed bumble bees busy making their home in a remote compost heap. We even tried making dandelion honey; delicious (but a bit

By the middle of the month, we had buttercups, cowslips, birdseye trefoil, red clover, speedwell (I had to look most of these up ?) and the grass was buzzing with all kinds of insects

including an early Red Admiral butterfly. We were amazed at how many different types of grasses we had, in addition to blue, purple, white and plenty of yellow flowers. The garden had really sprung to life. We'd had hardly any rain for the whole month, and where the short grass around our path was turning a sad and ugly brown, the un-mowed lawn was bursting with colour. By May 30th, a sea of Ox-eye daisies stood proudly a foot tall. Even my husband couldn't bring himself to mow. So we left it just a bit longer...

By mid-June, we found 6 different patches of pyramid orchids, where only a few months before was plain lawn, and a few patches of stinking iris (name doesn't do them justice, they don't stink and they look beautiful!). July brought us clouds of butterflies (gatekeepers, meadow browns, blues, whites, peacocks, tortoiseshells) and moths when we walked across the "used-to-be-lawn", grasshoppers pinging about, and the sound of chirping crickets in the evening that would make you think you were in the south of France.

Then the aliens landed. One particularly hot evening, lights off, windows open, I saw a glinting eye from across the garden. What kind of creature has one eye that glows in the dark?! Bravely, I set out into the dark (wellies on, just in case) and crept


> closer. Knee high in meadow, I looked around and counted 6 glowing lights in the garden. It was magical and mysterious, and unlike anything I had ever seen before. Some would call them glow worms. After close inspection from all the family, the boys settled on alien robot frogs which I tend to agree with.

> curiosity are good indicators of "ecological continuity" (leaving nature to get on with it...) as adult females cannot fly, and therefore can't get out of the way of lawn mowers.

Great news for my veg patch; they love eating snails (so that's why they don't need to move fast!). Glow worms are still reasonably common in ancient landscapes such as ours where habitats are well connected by hedgerows and grassy field margins and love the 'untidy corners' left uncut to act as refuges. Keep an eye out next time you're out after dark, and you may get a glimpse of some magical alien robot frogs too. Better still, try giving the lawn mower a rest next May, and you may be




