A raffle will also be run.








Visit to Lyminge by The Bishop of Dover

Pathways to the Past


Exploring the Legacy of Ethelburga

By the time you read this, one of the key aims of the project to create disabled access to our ancient Parish Church will have been fully implemented, with a remodelled level threshold to the north door to complement the new path laid in 2020.

We are now entering the last full month of the project. Lots of our plans will be reaching completion in the coming weeks. Watch out for:

- New information panels being installed around the village explaining the archaeology discovered over the last decade and more
- A new archaeological display in the Parish Church
- A new interactive programme allowing you to explore 3D digital reconstructions of the church site over 1,400 years, accessed through a touchscreen in the Parish Church
- New information displays in the Station Road car park, created in partnership with Lyminge Historical Society and Lyminge Parish Council
- New specially commissioned artworks installed in and around the Parish Church
- Queen Ethelburga's Ale, specially commissioned by the project for the Lyminge Anglo-Saxon Festival, on sale from the Coach and Horses.

We are delighted to be partnering with the Lyminge Association to put on the Lyminge Anglo-Saxon Festival 2021. After months of lock-down, here is an opportunity for our community to get out there and have a good time. Enjoy the programme of festivities (see elsewhere in this Newsletter), and perhaps raise a glass of festival ale to Queen Ethelburga!

DIARIES - One of the unexpected pleasures of keeping a daily journal is to look back and see how the style and contents change over the years; not so much in the details, that may simply reflect passing fluctuations in busyness, but in the larger picture that represents the ebb and flow of one's enthusiasms and preoccupations. My diary started as a record of events surrounding our newly-created garden pond, together with wider wildlife observations. Thus the first entry, on Saturday 21st May 1983, devoted a page to details of the completion of the pond, followed by: "The cob was killed whilst sleeping on the slipway just above the bridge, by a fox, in broad daylight. The pen has now abandoned the nest and is moping on the millpond." Throughout the nineties, the diary recorded an increasing emphasis on the minutiae of family life as children left home and we became more involved in caring for aged parents. I fretted over the humdrum nature of some of the entries, until I discovered The Diary of a Country Parson by the Rev James Woodforde. Begun in 1759

as an expense account ('For some soap pd 0.0.1'), it expanded over the next 44 years into several million words depicting his life in minute detail. The Diary is almost impossible to quote from, as its charm lies in the relentless build-up of narrative in Woodforde's uniquely homely voice. As Virginia Woolf wrote, "His diary is the only mystery about him." It is generally agreed that diaries are written for posterity, and Pliny the Elder advised "Not a day without a line." District Councillors' Update - June 2021

Waste Collection – All the crews are doing rounds that are brand new to them, so there is a high probability that some of the particular nuances of any given location (e.g. the bins are tucked behind the tree halfway up the drive and not readily visible, etc) are not known / overlooked by the person visiting the place for the first time. This familiarity is increased by repeatedly completing the rounds, and this will obviously increase over time. We also know that recycling tonnages from households are currently high (especially with cardboard packaging), and this has put additional pressure on the recycling collection crews' ability to complete the scheduled work. However, taking both of these issues into account, should any collections be known



to have not been completed on the scheduled day they are prioritised for completion the next morning. Please let me know if this does not happen.

Vaccination update – vaccine is currently being given to people who are aged 38 or over – you need to book at https://www.nhs.uk/.../book-coronavirus-vaccination - you should book your second appointment at the same time as booking the first. Vulnerable persons and other cohorts continue to be called by the NHS for their vaccination.

Specialist day care for those living with dementia – UK Hythe & Lyminge unit in Lyminge has been designed with dementia in mind. A day at the centre will include a variety of activities, specific to the needs of those living with dementia, providing a supportive environment which focuses on enabling people to make the most of each day. Open 5 days a week, Monday to Friday. The flexible service offers full or half day sessions, please contact 01303 269602 or email sm@ageukhl.org.uk for further information. A two course freshly prepared lunch will be provided with tea or coffee throughout the day. The charity shop is now open Mon-Fri 9-3 pm and Sat mornings.

National Leisure Recovery Fund - Following a successful bid by the District Council, the Marsh Academy Sports Centre in New Romney and Three Hills Sports Park in Folkestone were awarded financial support totalling £90,000.

Beach Huts – The regeneration project has seen 35 of the original structures retained and refurbished – together with the installation of 80 new wooden ones, in both large and smaller sizes. All previous tenants were given the opportunity to have a beach hut in the same location as the one previously leased to them. The remaining huts were then allocated – in date order – to those on the waiting list. As previously reported, the colourful Beach Huts will form part of the Folkestone Triennial.

Council Meetings - All Official Council Meetings will now take place in the Council Chamber. Councillors are asked to wear face masks and to take a lateral flow test before meetings. Only six members of the public will be allowed in the public gallery so members of the public are urged to continue to watch meetings on-line.

Scrap Metal Waste Carriers - Anyone removing waste, including scrap metal, tyres and building materials from properties across the District must ensure they are licensed to do so. Forty-five drivers of waste carriers were stopped at road checks in Folkestone last month in a joint operation with the Police.

My husband Ron died in April 2018 and we had been married for nearly 61 years. Prior to his death, Ron had become very thin. He used to dog walk over the field opposite our house in Brady Road.

In 1956 I bought Ron a very distinct gold signet ring for his birthday. Ron was in the Middle East doing his national service and we were engaged to be married the following year. I gave Ron the ring when he flew home on leave and he wore it from then on. Sadly, Ron lost the ring not many months before he died and we speculated it must have slipped from his finger when dog walking in the field.

Ron searched for the ring for weeks. Even after his death I often spent time looking for the ring hoping I would find it but to no avail. I put the word out to friends and even checked the police lost property; it became guite a mission for me to find it.

More recently I had concluded that I may never find it and then, out of the blue, I received a phone call from Tristan, the father of Joe, a 15 year old who had been metal detecting in the field. Clever Joe had found a ring and although the engraving on the front had worn off on the inside the inscription 'Love Marilyn 20.03.56' was clearly visible. Tristan and Joe then took the trouble to track me down and through word of mouth and public records, found me and were able to return the ring.

It is amazing to have Ron's ring back again through the kindness of Tristan and Joe.

I have lived in lovely Lyminge for well over 20 years but am soon moving to Hythe as the house is too big for me now. Another month and I would be gone which makes this story even more incredible. A fitting end perhaps to my years here and a reminder of the kindness of local people, especially Tristan and Joe to whom I give a huge heartfelt thank you. I am looking forward to a new beginning but will miss Lyminge for sure.



MEETINGS - It is no longer legal to hold council meetings remotely and therefore Face to Face meetings recommenced from 10th May. Meeting dates during May and June are disrupted due to the covid compliance complications imposed on venues and until we can revert to our usual timetable, meetings will be held on Wednesday evenings at Etchinghill Village Hall, but this may change, if restrictions change. Members of the public are always welcome to attend council meetings and we will always adhere to the current Covid guidelines relating to indoor meetings.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING -

A new date has been set for Wednesday 21st July (subject to covid restrictions) at 7.30pm at Lyminge Village Hall, all electors are welcome to attend.

ADDITIONAL COUNCILLOR

A vacancy has arisen and we ask interested applicants to express their interest to the clerk by the deadline of 30th June. This vacancy has arisen due to Chris Barnett having moved out of the area. Once again our thanks to Chris for all her past hard work on behalf of the parish.

NEW NOTICE BOARDS - As part of our plans to refresh a number of areas around the village, work to install new notice broads in Station Road Car Park, Lyminge, plus the re-location of some boards at Tayne Field and Jubilee Field should take place this month.

PLAY EQUIPMENT - The council are pleased to have agreed substantial financial support for the new Tayne playpark project being run by Lyminge Youth Action and we wish to thank them for all their dedication and hard work towards this project over the past couple of years. We look forward to assisting them in seeing this project through to completion.



In addition, council have agreed to commit funds to a refurbishment of the Jubilee toddler play area which we hope to action this year, as all of the soft-wood equipment is nearing the end of its life.

What to do now...June

June is a truly lovely month and all too short!

Sow undercover: beetroot, swede, lettuce, leaf beet, chard, kale, purple sprouting broccoli, cauliflower for both autumn & spring, calabrese for autumn harvests.

After solstice (21st June) sow endive, chicory, kohlrabi and Florence fennel.

Sow outside: same as undercover, also carrots, and cucumber early in June. For more information look at Sarah Raven's Website (www.sarahraven.com/articles/june-in-the-garden.htm). She has very useful information for all parts of the garden.

Let's focus on TOMATOES!

Tomatoes are delicious, popular and so versatile, but easy to get wrong, so here are some Top Tips for successful tomatoes this year.

There are two types – cordon and bush varieties. Some do better in a greenhouse, and most are fine outside in the garden. Try planting them in amongst your flowers, perhaps, to bring interest to the border. Bush varieties are such as Tumbling Tom – used in baskets and pots. They produce one flush of fruit and don't need any attention – maybe except feeding occasionally.

Cordon / standard types need staking and training, either up a string by just twisting the growing plant around the string or tied gently to a cane. If in the greenhouse – secure the string / cane to the top of the greenhouse. If outside make sure the cane is pushed in firmly to prevent the plant rocking about.

The main thing I get asked about tomato care is how to care for the cordon plant as it grows, to prevent it becoming out of control with green growth and how to make the plant concentrate on forming good fruit on one main stem?

- 1. Remove all suckers and their leaves below the first flower cluster. Do this no matter what kind of tomato plant you have.
- 2. Pinch out extra growth on the LEAF joins, as shown on the picture. DO NOT PINCH OUT FLOWERING TRUSSES those will bear the tomatoes.
- 3. Remove yellow leaves. Yellow leaves use up more sugar than they produce.
- 4. Top the plant. To get the best out of the last growth of the season, it is necessary to "top" the plant. Take out the top growing point once the plant has produced 5 fruit trusses or reached the top of the greenhouse!

Once the first flower truss has changed to fruit – tiny tomatoes – you need to start feeding the plant once a week with comfrey feed, liquid seaweed or equivalent.

Amphibians, reptiles, mammals and birds will prosper from this available larder, and we will be surrounded by nature in our own back gardens.

Biodiversity Pond and a New Scrape



As discussed in last month's newsletter, we have completed the planning stage for the Biodiversity Pond and New Scrape. Depending on the weather conditions the earth works and habitat creation will commence towards the end of June.



Things you can do in June

Leave a shallow tray of water amongst the flowers for bees and other insects.
Long dry spring and summer months dehydrate and kill thirsty pollinators. Bees
can drink up to their own body weight each day and some nursing bees need
water to make a jelly to feed their larva. Leave pebbles standing proud in the
water for the bees to land on and avoid drowning.



2. Create an area of soft mud. Consider an upturned dustbin lid or tray. With April 'achieving' one of the driest months on record recently, swallows and house martins are struggling to find and make mud pellets for building and fixing existing nests. Blackbirds and thrushes also use mud in their nest constructions. Providing this valuable resource could support numbers of these birds returning to our gardens & fields.



3. Give pollinators a helping hand and create an uncut border or sunny patch in your garden. Try to connect unmown areas to allow movement of ground dwelling pollinators including numerous bugs and beetles.

Barn Owls

Barn owls are busy transporting feasts back to their lodgings. The picture along side features a proud parent holding an unsuspecting field vole. The provision of long tussocky grass and undisturbed margins is critical for the successful breeding of small mammals.

Barn owls will feed each chick up to 7 small mammals a night. We hope that our continued management of the bumpy field will see an increase in numbers of these incredible birds, which have been seen ghosting across the church yard in previous years.





Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

It is 18 April 2021, the day of the Duke of Edinburgh's funeral. I am in London on a Covid permitted stay and in the early evening I take a walk along the South Bank of the Thames. It is the end of the school Easter holidays and also the first Saturday after lockdown restrictions were lifted, enabling pubs and restaurants to open for outside drinking and eating, but I am not prepared for the crowds all around: walking, sitting, eating and drinking. It feels like a Bank Holiday weekend.

Union flags are still flying at half mast on several buildings across the river, these will be restored to full mast once the day is over. The tide on the great River Thames is in flood so the flotsam and jetsam in the form of planks of wood and rubbish, is making its way upstream at a steady speed to the west towards Windsor, where the Duke has been so recently laid to rest. The sun too is in the west and its bright light is making moving sparkles on the water as it dodges about in constant agitation. But the crowds become too close so I decide to return tomorrow morning.

At 9 o'clock the following day, whilst still clear, fresh and bright I return to the same spot on the Embankment as last night, and I see a different scene. All is quiet: the rubbish has been cleared away and there are a few walkers, cyclists and joggers. The river is now flowing in the opposite direction, out to sea as the tide recedes with probably the same flotsam and jetsam now making its way eastwards instead of westwards, playing an endless game of push and pull. This seems to be a different London, one I have never seen before and it is at its most beautiful.

The seed balls from last year's plane trees are large and pendulous, looking like dull Christmas baubles whereas the new ones are either red or green, small and delicate in appearance. Grand lamp posts line the walkway, known as Dolphin Lamp Standards, with their dolphin or sturgeon sculptures wrapped around the pillar, above which is a fluted column, culminating in a globe shade atop of which sits a golden crown. These were designed by George John Vulliamy and modelled by Charles





Henry Driver, who was the architect of the Victoria Embankment wall and river stairs. They were based on statues of dolphins or fish with intertwined tails at the Fontana del Nettuno in the Piazza del Popolo in Rome. The Jubilee Walkway forms part of the South Bank and there are silver coloured ground markers all along this route, which was created in 1977 to commemorate the Queen's Silver Jubilee.

Looking across the river and to the east, the buildings are all angular, St Paul's being a notable exception with its pleasing dome, lit up in the morning sunshine. Once tall Restoration church spires are now dwarfed by the creations of modern architects. Lofty cranes litter the scene, as more building work takes place. High up, two vapour trails cross the sky - until Covid the sky would have been full of them. No aircraft noise either whereas before Covid, planes were continually lining up in an endless circuit as they approached Heathrow Airport – as one left to land, another joined.

Miniscule waves, not more than an inch or two high, manage to break on the now exposed river shore. These are enlarged when a boat passes, only to diminish once it has passed. I peer down at the shingle and sand and wish that I could go and mudlark, in the hope of finding some archaeological treasure which the Thames might have yielded up after centuries of keeping it hidden and safe.

I sit on a bench in the warm sunshine with a cup of hot chocolate, bought at a shining

caravan, whose owner is friendly and chatty. It is approaching 10 o'clock and I hear three different church clocks chime the hour in turn, including the sonorous tone of St Paul's, deeper and more senior sounding than the other two. To my right is a mosaic sign indicating that this is Gabriel's Wharf. Unfortunately I cannot find any historical explanation for the name. I catch snatches of conversation from the occasional passers-by; pigeons strut about in the sunshine, going through an elaborate courtship ritual; thin wispy white clouds up high, like smudged paint; Canada geese honk as they peck about on the foreshore nearby then two of them take off and fly to a floating pier in the middle of the river while nearby a cherry blossom tree is in full bloom, its flowers pendulous and white against the pure blue of the sky.

This morning is definitely the lull after last night's storm of people and I savour the sights, sounds and tranquillity that surround me.

Many verges will have the **Cuckoo Flower** [Cardamine pratensis] in bloom, sometimes callked Milkmaids or Lady's Smock. Its name comes from the fact that it appears at around the same time as the Cuckoo starts to be heard. The seed heads are long thin pods that burst later in the year to disperse the tiny seeds.

Grounsel [Senecio vulgaris] is also appearing now, with its very bunched yellow flowers. Later in the year these produce windblown white fluffly seed heads which is the reason for its botanical name which comes from the Latin for 'old man'.
