#### **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

For various reasons I changed my pattern of walking for a while and after strolling through the churchyard on a particularly beautiful evening, I decided to revisit this quiet space at different times of the day to greater appreciate what it has to offer.

That evening, when the sun had set and the sky was clear, with the first stars beginning to make a faint appearance, I could see the black silhouettes of bats, their characteristic flitting flight distinguishing them from late flying birds, and so easily missed, as their cries are inaudible to our ears, yet all important to them for their navigation and search for food. Flowers, so bright during daylight hours, now quietly pale and spectral in the diminishing light. There is a powerful stillness in the crepuscular (resembling



or relating to twilight) light before night falls, with the occasional bird singing its last song of the day, hoping to impress a potential mate who too might have stayed up late to hear and be wooed by it.



Another visit in the late afternoon of a bright and sunny day highlighted the many Spring flowers: primroses, both yellow and purple, an indicator of ancient woodland; winter aconites with their golden sheen, looking deceptively benign, but in fact somewhat poisonous; daffodils, of many varieties; violets gathered in coy clumps; muscari, with their blue grape-like blooms; dandelions (the Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland report that there are about 250 species recorded in Britain and Ireland); Germander speedwell, easily missed but thought to be a good luck charm for travellers, the bright flowers intended to 'speed' you on your way and wood anemones, which is another flower of ancient woodlands. There is also emerging foliage

with the promise of more flowers, such as bluebells and cow parsley, whose personalities are stronger than those of the early Spring flowers.

My final visit, before putting pen to paper, was with a friend, and it was a fine bright sunny morning,

with a chill wind. The clouds were 'picture book' clouds, the sort children draw, and they were layer upon layer, making for a busy and attractive sky. We took photos of the church using my friend's lens ball, a fascinating piece of photographic equipment. After admiring the wide variety of flowers, we sat on a bench overlooking the churchyard, drinking in its simple scene and listening to the varied birdsong, making the most of our permitted time together.

Springtime is surely the best of times to enjoy the botanical treasures that a country churchyard can hold and as I wander amongst the gravestones, pondering on past lives, many now forgotten, I imagine that the traditional inscription of RIP might be fulfilled in this most peaceful of places, with the



be fulfilled in this most peaceful of places, with the chiming of the church clock marking the steady passage of time.

#### Letters To The Editor.....

56 bits of dog poo in less than 500 metres. Is the path from Etchinghill towards Postling the pooiest footpath in the area?

We walked from Postling to Lyminge the other day across the field, then dropping down past the orchards into Etchinghill and then across the golf course [to post a letter in Lyminge]. The path rises from the Sandling Road/Staple Lane junction just north of Postling to where it crosses the Elham Valley Way and then descends through orchards to Etchinghill. On the way down, just on the downhill stretch, there was so much dog poo that we decided to count the poo on the way back.

So, leaving Etchinghill on path HE56/6 you cross a little stream and the path then rises through the orchards until it crosses the Elham Valley Way. There are 56 lots of excrement in the section from the stream to the Elham Valley Way. Then two more bits of poo nicely sited in the middle of the fabulous path which drops down through the green field towards Postling. I've looked at the Kent Public Rights of Way site and the section with 56 bits of poo is less than 500 metres. It is not one culprit, unless that person has all sorts of dogs doing all sorts of poo of different colours and sizes.

We would actually be prepared to pick it all up but our lack of confidence in dog owners makes us sceptical that it would stay poo-less.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE RELATING TO LOCAL ELECTIONS SCHEDULED FOR 6 MAY 2021**

One of the candidates for the Elham Valley County Council division has died after nominations closed and before postal votes were sent out. The election for this one seat has therefore been cancelled in accordance with electoral law and will now take place within 35 working days of 06 May.

IMPORTANT The election for the Police & Crime Commissioner will still go ahead on O6 May.

The new election for County Council is now been set for Thursday 17 June and I have asked KCC's Democratic Services team to put in place a temporary contact email to pick up the normal queries and problems I would deal with as your local member as I will cease to be your County Councillor from 10 May and there will be no one in place until after the new election.

#### District Councillors' Update - May 2021



Message of condolence from the Chairman of Folkestone & Hythe District Council on the death of His Royal Highness Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh

Chairman of Folkestone & Hythe District Council, Cllr Ann Berry said, "On behalf of the councillors and staff of Folkestone & Hythe District Council I would like to express our great sadness on hearing of the death of His Royal Highness Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh. "Prince Philip influenced the lives of so many through his Duke of Edinburgh Awards scheme. We extend our deepest sympathies to Her Majesty The Queen and the Royal Family at this time."

Vaccination - The vaccination programme continues to advance and over 87% of the top nine priority groups have been vaccinated with at least one dose. Our large vaccination centres will have limited appointments for first dose vaccinations this month: second doses will go ahead as planned. This is linked to national vaccine supply. It is a temporary position and appointments at all sites will increase again as soon as supply allows.

Otterpool Park - Please keep looking at the www.otterpoolpark.org website for up to date information. The recent Webinar on Phase One with presentations by the project team and its consultants can be viewed now on the Website. The consultation period for phase one has been extended until 7 May and there is still the opportunity to complete the survey on the website.

Community Hubs - The way the district's three community hubs quickly swung into action to support Folkestone & Hythe residents during the COVID-19 pandemic has gained national recognition. The District Council, set up the Folkestone, Romney Marsh and Hythe hubs with three local organisations within hours of the first national lockdown being announced, and we were presented with a certificate of excellence in the iESE Public Sector Transformation awards.

Folkestone Town Centre - Residents are being encouraged to get involved and have their say about the future of Folkestone town centre as part of Folkestone & Hythe District Council's Place Plan project. A virtual webinar - the first public Place Plan event - was held on 19 April. The event was run by urbanism consultants 'We Made That' who have been appointed by the council to run the project. The webinar was recorded and is available to view on the Place Plan section of the council website

Rough Sleepers – nine new privately rented accommodation units are about to open in central Folkestone. The privately rented accommodation in central Folkestone will have an on-site manager and also a support network to help the people living there to move to a more settled way of life. This is a project following collaboration between the District Council, Porchlight and the Rainbow Centre.

Ship Street - the District Council has bought the Ship Street site in Folkestone (former gas works site) and it will be developed for housing in a joint project with the Creative Quarter. The Council's housing stock is due to be carbon neutral by 2030.

KCC and PCC elections 6 May - Please note the KCC election for the Elham Valley Division has been cancelled due to the death of a candidate in accordance with electoral law. A new election will take place within 35 days of 6 May. The PCC election will take place as planned on 6 May.

# Pathways to the Past

#### **Exploring the Legacy of Ethelburga**



Plans for the Anglo-Saxon themed Lyminge Festival 2021 continue to progress. We are keeping our fingers crossed that Covid restrictions will be lifted allowing the festival to proceed in the two weeks 21 June to 4 July. See below in this newsletter for details of how to pre-order **Queen Ethelburga's**Ale, specially brewed for the festival by local brewer Canterbury Ales.

Work continued during April to put the finishing touches to the churchyard. Curled finials have been created for the new handrail on the path up to the church by local blacksmith Maurice Gill, and these have now been installed. Maurice has also renewed and repaired the ironwork on the north

door. Further work is now planned in the coming weeks to remodel the threshold for this door, creating a level entry that will give easier access for those with impaired mobility. This has always been one of the key objectives of the project, and was a principal reason for receiving a grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund in the first place.

Work is also progressing on the new archaeological display for the church that will house a selection of artefacts from the dig in 2019 and the screen through which you will be able to explore 3D digital models of the church through its 1,400 year history.

We are still looking for funding to help us complete this project. 

**MURPHY** – More recently we celebrated the 70th birthday of Murphy's Law, a new name for an old truth, usually stated as 'If anything can go wrong, it will.' There are many theories about its origin, but most experts agree with the Oxford English Dictionary that 'Murphy' was Captain Edward Murphy, an aerospace test engineer.

In 1949 Murphy worked for the US Air Force on experiments testing human tolerance to acceleration. In one crucial test, Murphy's assistant set 16 two-way sensors incorrectly, causing a zero reading and Murphy's immortal phrase "If there's more than one way to do a job, and one of those ways will result in disaster, then somebody will do it that way."



Murphy's Law became popular in the 1950s among technical and scientific workers, often with additions such as Finagle's Corollary, which adds that things always go wrong "...at the worst possible moment."

Biologists claim that "Under any given set of environmental conditions an experimental animal behaves as it damn well pleases" and audio technicians that "Connecting leads and plugs always develop a fault five minutes after the last useful shop has closed for the weekend." Military men and airline pilots often murmur, "The more advanced your equipment the further you will be from civilization when it fails."

The popular statement of this principle in Britain, especially amongst non-technical people, is of course Sod's Law, which states variously that it only rains at weekends or that the phone only rings when you're in the bath. I was surprised to discover that the Oxford English Dictionary has no reference to Sod's Law before 1970 as I was convinced that I and my parents and grandparents had been using the name all our lives. Perhaps in those days people were more accepting of misfortune and simply consoled themselves with "Accidents will happen".

# The Church Road Surgery, Lyminge Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Since 2015, surgeries have been asked to arrange a patient participation group (PPG). This is a group of patients interested in health and healthcare issues, who want to be involved with, and support the running of their local GP Practice. It seeks to empower those that are served by the Practice. Importantly, this continues to be a two-way dialogue in which patients and the Practice work together.



Most PPGs include members of practice staff, and meet at regular intervals for a couple of hours around every three months to decide ways and means of making a positive contribution to the services and facilities offered by the practice to its patients.

The Church Road Surgery currently enjoys a high rating in the most recent local GP Patient Survey (NHS England, www.gp-patient. co.uk) and wishes to continue to build on this success. This, in part, is through feedback from the PPG. Currently, there are a few vacancies for volunteers and we would like to hear from anybody who can spare no more than a couple of hours every 3 months.

More recently, these meetings have been moved to the Zoom platform. # YOUR PARISH COUNCIL'S BUDGET FOR 2021/22

The Parish Precept is the part of your annual Council Tax that is allocated to the Parish Council. In the current financial year, the Precept amounts to just under Compared with the previous £68,000. financial year, the Precept has increased by an amount equivalent to 24p per week for a Band D household. generate an additional £13,000 for the council to spend on projects around the parish. In these difficult times, no one treats an increase in household costs lightly, and we think it is important for everyone to understand how the council spends this money.

#### Recurring annual costs

You can divide council expenditure into two broad pots. There is the recurring cost of running the parish, fulfilling our statutory obligations, and maintaining council assets like Tayne Field, Court Lodge Green ("the Bumpy Field") and Jubilee Field. In the current financial year, these recurring costs amount to some £33,000. As we do every year, we also plan to offer up to £9,000 in grants to support local clubs and community groups that face one-off costs that they will otherwise have difficulty meeting. Recurring costs account for just under two thirds of the Precept.

#### One-off projects

Using the remaining one third of the Precept, plus reserves built up in previous years, the council plans to undertake one-off projects. Sometimes we need to spend on repairs or replacement of existing

assets, and currently we are facing a number of large costs after many years when not much was spent. We had to replace the bridge in Tayne Field in 2020, and we are currently budgeting for the significant costs of repairing the running track in Jubilee Field, the Well House in Well Field (which is a statutory obligation as it is a listed building) and the play equipment in both Jubilee Field and Tayne Field. We are working in partnership with Lyminge Youth Action to extend the play equipment on Tayne Field. We hope that it will be possible to secure grants to help with this, and LYA themselves have been fund-raising to help. But much of the cost, in the end will be borne by the Parish Council and we have already committed funds to allow the project to proceed this year.

We know that the environment is important to many people and as a responsible council, we want to do what we can to That is why we have committed £10,000 in our current budget to improve the area at the bottom of the Bumpy Field. to enhance the flood defences and so that we will have a pond supporting biodiversity in addition to the existing pond that serves to manage water run-off from the road. We are also intending to commit £5,000 annually for small-scale environmental projects, that cumulatively will do much to improve our surroundings and help the We have already implemented new management schemes for the Bumpy Field, Tayne Field and Well Field that will encourage wild flowers and a greater range of wildlife. We have planted new trees along the edge of Tayne Field, and

are preparing plans for a new Forest Garden on the edge of Jubilee Field. So far we have planted over 6,000 new trees around the parish.

We know that traffic management is a huge concern for almost everyone in the parish, either as drivers or as pedestrians or in both these capacities. We are fortunate that we have no hazards that are so acute they have caused injury or death. But this also means that KCC will not prioritise work in Lyminge because there are plenty of sites that need to be addressed elsewhere in the county where deaths have occurred. Nevertheless, we all know that there are traffic problems within the parish that need to be addressed. If we want to do anything about them, that will mean the Parish Council will have to find the money to make improvements. In the current year, we have committed funds to begin the process of identifying what can be done. Nothing will be cheap, so we will have to evaluate the options based upon the benefits that will be delivered.

We hope this will give a better understanding of how your money is spent by the Parish Council. We are committed to making the parish a better place to live, and that means we must find the resources to make this happen. We are convinced that the Parish Precept still represents exceptional value for money and that everyone will see benefits from our plans in the years ahead. We are so grateful to Anne Gould from Lyminge Gardeners' Society for giving us so much of her time and expertise to support another group of 'newbies' to successfully grow some of their own food. We hope to be able to share some photos of the new gardens in production later in the year.

#### What to do now...May

Sowings in May define your summer and autumn harvests, even winter ones. For example the first half of May is good for undercover sowings of summer beans, autumn cabbage and brussels sprouts. Basil and beans need steady warmth to grow. Even in mid May best results are from germinating seeds under cover to avoid damage from slugs, cold nights, cold winds and yes even frost! In 2020 here in Lyminge I think our last frost was around May 14th!

Spring is the season for aphids, hatching out from winter hibernation. May is awkward because aphid numbers have to increase before predators can get going themselves. Watering is the best way to reduce aphid damage, because aphids like dry conditions and plants stressed by lack of moisture. Water leaves where aphids are clustering and roots so that the plant strength increases.

Pot on your tomatoes if not already done. Don't put small seedlings into too big a pot - they prefer their roots confined. So first pricking out goes into 7cm /3in pots.

Cut back overgrown sage, chives, marjoram, fennel. Also pot on or plant out your companion plants (sweet-peas, sunflowers, nasturtiums, marigolds and calendula etc..) ready to pop in among your veggies!

Sow undercover - Courgette, French and climbing beans (runners), leaf beet, beetroot, chard, lettuce, winter brassicas, salad onion. Plus leeks and winter squash by early May. Swede at end May

Sow outside - same as undercover, also main crop potatoes in early May, carrots, parsnips but keep seedbed moist until germinated. After mid month even late May, outside sow cucumber, courgette, squash inc. pumpkin, sweetcorn. Herbs, such as basil, sown undercover in April will need pricking out and potting on.

# **Biodiversity Pond and a New Scrape**



The LCA have been working on this with the Lyminge Parish Council for some time and we now have all our ducks in a row to move forward. We will create a 12 metre biodiversity pond as shown in the first image below. In doing so we create a larger storage area to help deal with heavy rain events and create some important habitat at the same time.

We have discussed the plan with highway engineers and have taken on-board their advice. There will be some considerable earthworks going on and this can always look a bit unsightly for a bit but in the long run it will be a fantastic asset for the parish residents and its



wildlife.

We are also going to take advantage of the natural features of Well Field and do a small amount of enhancement to create a seasonal scrape. The scrape will provide a small area of bare ground, which will be designed to hold water during the wetter times of the year, creating a habitat for amphibians, insects and birds.

## Forest Garden in Lyminge




With the on-going success of the community allotment, the Thoughtful Food Group (part of the LCA) are working in conjunction with Lyminge Gardeners' Society on the next project. This is a very exciting opportunity to set up a Community Forest Garden in Lyminge which will benefit everybody. With the support of the Parish Council who own the land, the

garden will be set up in the corner of Jubilee Field behind the tennis court.

A Forest Garden is a planted area that is purposely designed to imitate the functioning of a woodland ecosystem, with a large variety of

different plants that will complement each other, and, most importantly, provide a yield in terms of food that can be foraged by the community. This would typically include some fruit trees, smaller fruit bushes or shrubs, as well as herbs and flowers at the lower levels that can be eaten or provide other benefits such as attracting pollinators.



The principles of forest gardening can be replicated in even the smallest of gardens or community spaces, including public parks, school grounds and even mini-forest gardens planted in containers! To support with the design we are commissioning, with the financial support of The Lyminge Association, a member of the National Forest Gardening Scheme who designed the beautiful and successful community Forest Garden in Margate.

#### **Habitat Creation**

A review of the current wildlife that we are lucky to find in the Lyminge Parish has been undertaken. We have identified a selection of habitat boxes that will make a positive contribution to this local biodiversity. When you are out walking, keep an eye out for Barn Owl homes, Swallow and Martin domes, a Tree Creeper nest, Robin and Wren bungalow's, Sparrow terraces and a large Tawny Owl mansion. We will also have a handful of Bat caves going up, and we plan to do bat walks later in the year for local families when we are able.





This photograph was sent in by Margaret Saunders and is of **Jelly Ear Fungus** or **Wood Ear Fungus**. [Auricularia auricula-judae]. So named as its appearance is like a human ear! It is usually found drooping from dead and dying branches of mainly elder but sometimes on other types of hardwood, particularly beech, sycamore and ash. It likes damp, shady conditions.

One of the Jelly Ear's other common names is *Judas's Ear*. This name alludes to the fact that the 'ears' appear mostly on elder – the tree species that Judas is said to have hanged himself on after betraying Jesus. The legend is that the 'ears' which emerge from elder wood represent his tormented soul.

# Mystery Flower I



What has happened to our local naturalists? Not one person has identified the tiny red spiky flower from last month!!

It is the female flower of the Hazel Tree. At the left hand side of the photo was the clue of the familiar yellow male catkin. Those who suffer from hay fever will be aware of the pollen in the spring air, some of which will be coming from these catkins and finding its wind-blown way to the tiny red stigmas shown. Later in the year, these will develop into hazel nuts that are so liked by squirrels.
