Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

It is the end of July and we are on an LNER AZUMA train bound for Scotland to see our son, whom we have not seen for over two years due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Leaving London King's Cross station we are soon speeding away from the metropolis and heading towards open

country. Buddleia bushes line the embankment with the occasional white of convolvulus. Trains flash past seemingly inches from my face and now rosebay willowherb, ragwort, yarrow and teasels are added to the mix by the side of the track. We pass in and out of old brick built tunnels and are going too fast to read the names of the stations as we rush by. There are fields of solar panels, wheat, barley, broad beans, oil seed rape and maize, a few of the cereal crops already having been harvested and the straw baled up. Those still growing are a rich dusky gold with deep tractor tracks cutting through, both straight and curved, the latter where the tractor turned for the next run.



Mottled clouds pepper the sky with plenty of blue in between - the sunshine alighting on different fields, highlighting the colours. Pylons march over the landscape, crossing fields, villages, rivers and roads. Wind turbines sedately turn with their soothing circular rhythm. Cooling towers sit solid and squat in the distance: old and new technology in juxtaposition each providing power. A long-dead tree, struck by lightning years ago, sends skeletal fingers skywards. Tall church spires pointing heavenwards and more earthbound squat square towers dot the landscape, each an indication of a village or community hidden from view. Passing through Peterborough I spot a mosque with its large green dome and matching smaller green dome on the minaret.

Speeding northwards through Lincolnshire, we pass over level crossings, one with a keeper's cottage with pretty geometric white latticed windows. Greyer clouds begin to fill the sky as we approach York and the temperature drops a little. The Yorkshire Moors rise to the east, making for a more interesting view after the flat fields of the East Midlands. Next stop Darlington Station, a Grade II* listed building built in Victorian times and 232 miles north of King's Cross. It has fluted pillars painted white with the ornate capitals picked out in grey. Colourful painted coats of arms fill the roundels each side of the capitals.

A footpath winds through a field of wheat; campers have set up camp in the corner of a field; an ugly dump of



old vehicles, dropped haphazardly by a huge grabber. There are now dark and pale grey clouds interspersed with patches of blue and turquoise in one direction and a deeper blue in another. Durham looms into view with its distinctive cathedral and castle on the hill. Further on a Greek style folly perches on top of a distant hill, like a miniature Parthenon. Next is Gateshead, with the Angel of the North, the largest sculpture in England, standing sentinel on a nearby hill, its outstretched wings horizontal. Now Newcastle, with its iconic rail and road bridges over the Tyne, testament to yet more impressive Victorian engineering. Continuing the journey I can see rain falling from a distant cloud in faint vertical lines; a communication mast, shining silver, catches the afternoon sun. And now, at last, the sea! What I have been waiting for all of the trip - the Northumberland coast. We pass in and out of the rain cloud and back into the sunshine, the skyscape having changed once more as the

clouds align themselves along the coast. In the distance the white sail of a yacht stands out against the grey of the sea. I recognise the small coastal village of Alnmouth as we pass by, with happy memories of a day spent there two years ago. The tide is out and small boats lean to one side on the wet sand of the estuary. One black sheep in a field of white ones. Black and white belted Galloways, their white midriffs so distinctive. Out to sea, the holy island of Lindisfarne, its priory and castle at its southern end with the flatter area carrying the causeway to the north. Further on two white-washed cottages in the distance are lit up by the sun against a dark grey shower filled sky. We are now running very close to the cliff edge and in one cleft I see surfers and in another, three or four houses right near to the sea, almost seeming to tumble into it. I am looking out for the abandoned shell of a cottage, open to the elements, perched on top of a cleft, which always provokes thoughts of who lived there, when and what caused them to leave - lives lived in another era.

We are now approaching the Scottish border as a lighthouse heralds Berwick-upon-Tweed. The tide is out and the mudflats are expansive. There are the wrecked and rotting remains of a wooden boat, just above the tide mark.

After a brief stop, we are leaving Berwick behind and the field crops change to potatoes and one of a soft purple, interspersed with red poppies and white flowers. I wonder if this crop is alfalfa? We swing inland and a sign alongside the track says 'Edinburgh 50 miles' in large white metal letters. The ears of a hare protrude from a field of wheat and a little further on, dense conifers march up a steep slope, holding dark secrets within. A brief glimpse of the volcanic Bass Rock in the outer part of the Firth of Forth estuary, its summit covered in the white droppings of its colony of gannets. Houses and settlements become more frequent as we approach the environs of Edinburgh: Waverley is our changing point, where we



take the local train to Falkirk, our final destination and home of the Falkirk Wheel and the Antonine Wall.

After eighteen months of pandemic, lockdowns and restrictions, it has been a joy to travel the length of the country and see the changing view.



COUNTRY NOTES - The other evening, walking home in the dusk from choir practice and still humming the last few bars of music, we heard an owl hooting in the trees in Kearsney Abbey. It reminded us that, twenty years ago, the owl was a familiar sound at night, as magical and as reassuring as the sound of the waterfall across the road. Since then, the combination of the Great Hurricane and the council's safety policies have ensured that the most precarious trees have been removed, and the owls and bats that lived in them are not now around in the same number.

It also reminded us of Gilbert White, author of The Natural History and Antiquities of Selborne, and his preoccupation with

the sound of the owl. On the 4th December 1770 he wrote in his journal "Most owls seem to hoot exactly in B flat according to several pitch-pipes used in tuning of harpsichords, and as strictly at concert pitch."

John Julius Norwich, in Christmas Crackers (Penguin 1980), published this quotation and added the following from Professor Howard Evans of Fort Collins, Colorado: "Even the simple wing sounds of midges and mosquitoes play a role in bringing the sexes together. In this case it is the female that attracts the male by the hum of her wings, a fact quickly apparent to singers who hit a G in the vicinity of a swarm and end up with a mouthful of male mosquitoes."

Which is perhaps a good a reason as any for limiting oneself to no more than humming when walking home from choir practice.

District Councillors' Update - September 2021



Kerbside Waste Collection – We are sorry the problems with the kerbside waste collections have continued across the district. The number of staff needing to self-isolate (the 'pingdemic') as well as the continued shortage of HGV drivers have been the latest issues. The District Council has therefore (reluctantly) agreed with its contractor Veolia that the garden waste service (brown top bin) is suspended and all resources are concentrated on the core services – food waste, recycling (purple top bin and black box for paper/card) and the residual waste (green top bin). You can either report a missed bin to Veolia from 10am - 4pm Monday to Friday on 0203 567 2468 or on www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/ We are also taking up any problems reported to us with the senior managers at the District Council.

Climate Change Focus - work has been ongoing on a series of measures to help protect the environment both now and in the future - including a commitment to hit a net-zero carbon emissions target by 2030. See Climate Change and Ecological Emergency briefing note - Folkestone & Hythe District Council (folkestone-hythe.gov.uk)

Employer Recognition Scheme (ERS) Gold Award - We're pleased to report that the District Council has received a Gold Award in recognition of its work with the Armed Forces community. This is the highest standard of award from the Ministry of Defence to organisations and covers work done with veterans, military families, reservists and serving personnel. Jenny has particular responsibility for this area of the council's work and says: "We're very proud of our military heritage and this gold award represents the work we do to honour the sacrifices made by those who serve the country."

New Leisure Centre at Princes Parade - There will now be a Public Enquiry held in October into the proposed changes to the road at Princes Parade in Hythe which forms part of the plans for the new Leisure Centre, homes and public spaces. Meanwhile the ITT (Invitation to Tender) document was issued for the running of the Leisure Centre so the tender process for this part of the project is not delayed.

Locally Jenny attended the Parish Council meeting on 28 July. Susan attended the coffee morning held in Lyminge church to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Support (music by some talented locals as well as coffee and cake) and the Rhodes Minnis Summer Show held in Rhodes Minnis village hall with a fine display of flowers, vegetable, baking and crafts. Both events were on 07 August and it was good to see people connecting with one another again.





What to do now...September

September is a month of picking, harvesting, eating and preserving all your wonderfully fresh crops. Tomatoes should still be ripening, courgettes may be tailing off but beans will keep going as long as you keep picking them.

- When you think you've harvested your last potatoes, carefully dig over the veg bed, collect those that were still lurking under the surface.
- Bean and pea plants that have finished their harvest can be cut back, leaving the roots to be dug in to the soil to provide extra nitrogen for future crops.
- Continue to feed tomato plants until all the fruits have finished growing and ripening. If your tomatoes refuse to ripen in miserable weather, then you could make a delicious green tomato chutney (see recipe below!)
- Sow spring onions these will be ready to eat before the frosts get going in most parts of the country. Even if frosts are forecast, they are fine under glass or plastic to harvest through late winter and autumn.
- Remove any crops that have finished leaving unneeded areas clear weed and tidy for the winter. Mulch with a layer of compost / manure.
- Keep an eye on your brassicas for butterfly eggs and caterpillars; these will most probably be under the leaves.
- · Sow Swiss chard, winter spinach, broad beans and hardy peas.
- Keep watering winter squash and pumpkins if the weather is hot. This will prevent their growth from being checked. Use stored rainwater wherever possible. Keep pinching out the tips of 'triffid-like' pumpkins and squash.
- Sow all your autumn-winter picking salad leaves and herbs if not done in August.
- · Pot up strawberry runners to make new plants for next summer.

Homemade Spicy Tomato and Apple Chutney

With the abundance of apples and tomatoes, it is a good idea to use them in as many different ways as possible. Below is an chutney recipe brought across from Canada by my mother and based on apples and tomatoes, with added raisins and dates. I hope you enjoy this spicy chutney as much as I do. Editor

1.8kg green tomatoes

450g bramley cooking apples

2 bananas

230g raisins

450g brown sugar

560g shallots or onions

12 red chillies or 1.5 - 2tsp cayenne pepper

7 - 14g powdered ginger

Shake of paprika

2tsp celery salt

14g salt

125g cooking dates

1 pint vinegar

- Mince or chop the tomatoes, apples, shallots, dates and raisins
- Add spices
- Place all ingredients in a preserving pan and bring to boil
- Simmer for about 2 hours until the chutney has the right consistency
- Bottle in cool sterlised jars (110°C for 10mins)

To make apple chutney, reverse the quantities of apples and tomatoes



Red Bartsia, and the Red Bartsia Bee, on Court Lodge Green



The improved management of Court Lodge Green is already having visible impacts on the diversity of the wild-flowers, with more flowers flourishing as dominant vigorous grasses are suppressed by the revised cutting regime and the seeding in places of yellow rattle which parasitises grass roots. One wild flower which has benefited is red bartsia, another semi-parasitic wild flower in the same family as yellow rattle, which also requires slightly disturbed soils and is far more abundant in many areas of Court Lodge Green than in previous years. Consequently the red bartsia bee, a relatively scarce native wild bee, can currently be spotted

fairly easily along the main path up the centre of the green. Noticeably smaller than the honey bees and bumblebees which are also enjoying the red bartsia flowers, the red bartsia bee has pale hair bands on its dark abdomen, a hairy, almost fluffy, face, and slightly swollen feet. Red bartsia bees are solitary mining bees, excavating nests in compacted soil – although nesting has rarely been observed in the UK so try to keep an eye out to try to find out where they are nesting on or near Court Lodge Green. Also worth looking out for is the red bartsia bee's "cuckoo" bee,



the scarce and wasp-like blunthorn nomad bee, which like cuckoos simply lays eggs in the nests of red bartsia bees and other related "blunthorn" bees, letting the host bee collect all the pollen necessary to feed their grubs. It is most likely to be seen nectaring on ragwort or other wild flowers within flying distance of blunthorn bee nesting sites, and can be distinguished from other black-and-yellow nomad bees by its black antennae, two yellow spots at the back of the thorax, and bright orange legs.






